Eligibility

<u>California Adolescent Sexual Health Needs Index</u> (CASHNI) scores are based on a formula that includes each county's:

- adolescent birth rate;
- annual number of live births to females under age 19;
- percentage of repeat teen births;
- gonorrhea incidence rate;
- percentage of youth living in concentrated areas of poverty;
- percentage of youth living in racially isolated areas of African Americans, Hispanics or American Indian / Alaskan Natives;
- percentage of 18 24 year olds without a high school diploma or equivalent; and
- rural community status.

MSSAs with a CASHNI score greater than 200 (listed in table below) are designated as highneed MSSAs for the purposes of meeting CA PREP youth targeting criteria a and b (see Part II. Program Requirements, for more information about categories of eligible youth).

For continuity of services, agencies will be allowed to continue to provide services at all active sites in high-need MSSAs approved during the 2015-18 program cycle (designated using 2012 CASHNI data). The updated 2014 CASHNI (see link on page 1) should be utilized

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for all new site identification. New sites that do not meet one of the other eligibility criteria will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis by the CDPH/MCAH Program Consultant.




To determine the MSSA of a service delivery location:

- 1. Visit the <u>UCSF California Health Maps Website</u>, address locator at https://www.californiahealthmaps.org/
- 2. In "Select Area Type" dropdown menu, select "Medical Service Study Area (MSSA)"
- 3. Enter the address of the service delivery location into the "Location Search" search bar (you may need to press enter or the magnifying glass button to begin the search).
- 4. Once the map updates for the address you entered, scroll down to view the tables and graphs below the map.
- 5. Underneath the interactive map, highlighted in purple on the left of the page, you will find the MSSA name and in parentheses, the MSSA number.

Example: Enter the address of a potential site to find its MSSA number. In this example, 1615 Capitol Ave, Sacramento CA was entered.



Scroll down to see the MSSA name and number in Purple. In this example, the MSSA for 1615 Capitol Ave is 139i.



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
