Percent (%), 95% confidence interval (95% CI) and estimated number of women in the population with the health indicator/characteristic (i.e., numerator of the percent rounded to the nearest hundred) are weighted to represent all women with a live birth who resided in California in 2013-2015. Population estimate (N) is a three-year average. Urban and Rural/Frontier designations are based on the population size or densities of Medical Service Study Areas.
