
## **Algorithm for Prioritizing Carbapenemase Testing**

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup>Contact your local health department to access free carbapenemase testing through a public health lab. In order of priority and as resources allow, obtain carbapenemase testing for other epidemiologically relevant patient isolates, including those: epi-linked to a new CPO case (roommate, residing on same unit, or sharing bathroom, healthcare personnel or medical equipment); admitted from facility with known CPO cluster/outbreak; with history of overnight healthcare exposure or invasive procedure outside U.S.; or admitted from long-term acute care hospital or ventilator-equipped skilled nursing facility, especially with indwelling medical devices.
