## **Annual Vacancy Report Summary**

## Department Overview:

- 1. The overall vacancy rate went down from 7.80% last year to 7.70% this year.
- 2. The number of filled positions went up from 3881.50 in 2019 to 3997.05 in 2020 resulting in 115.55 more positions filled in 2020.
- 3. The number of vacant positions increased from 328.15 in 2019 to 333.60 in 2020 resulting in 5.45 more vacant positions in 2020.
- 4. The number of established positions went up from 4209.65 last year to 4330.65 this year. This is a net increase of 121 PYs.

## Center Vacancy Trends:

- 1. Center for Health Statistics and Informatics decreased its vacancy rate from 8.19% to 3.07%.
- 2. Center for Healthy Communities decreased its vacancy rate from 11.96% to 8.24%.
- 3. Center for Infectious Diseases increased its vacancy rate from 9.16% to 10.45%.
- 4. Center for Family Health decreased its vacancy rate from 6.88% to 5.51%.
- 5. Center for Environmental Health increased its vacancy rate from 8.73% to 11.09%.
- 6. Center for Health Care Quality increased its vacancy rate from 5.94% to 7.41%.

## The Department's overall vacancy rate can partially be attributed to:

- A total of 3 new positions were added by Budget Change Proposals on April 1, 2020. A total of 121 new positions were added by Budget Change Proposals effective July 1, 2020. A total of 3 new positions were added by Budget Change Proposals effective October 1, 2020. In addition, 4 limited-term positions expired June 30, 2020 and 2 positions were moved to Agency.
- 2. The department has specialized, technical positions that require specific licensure and education requirements which lengthen the amount of time to fill positions.
- 3. The department is holding positions outside of the department vacancy pool for the cannabis program since these positions are moving under a new department effective July 1, 2021.
