Annual Vacancy Report Summary

Department Overview:

- 1. The overall vacancy rate went up from 7.70% last year to 8.26% this year.
- 2. The number of filled positions went down from 3997.05 in 2020 to 3974.85 in 2021 resulting in 22.2 less positions filled in 2021.
- 3. The number of vacant positions increased from 333.60 in 2020 to 357.8 in 2021 resulting in 24.2 more vacant positions in 2021.
- 4. The number of established positions went up from 4330.65 last year to 4332.65 this year. This is a net increase of 2 PYs due to the Cannabis transition of 119 PYs.

Center Vacancy Trends:

- 1. Center for Health Statistics and Informatics increased its vacancy rate from 3.07% to 8.62%.
- 2. Center for Healthy Communities increased its vacancy rate from 8.24% to 8.37%.
- 3. Center for Infectious Diseases decreased its vacancy rate from 10.45% to 10.45%.
- 4. Center for Family Health decreased its vacancy rate from 5.51% to 4.84%.
- 5. Center for Environmental Health decreased its vacancy rate from 11.09% to 4.56%.
- 6. Center for Health Care Quality increased its vacancy rate from 7.41% to 10.70%.

The Department's overall vacancy rate can partially be attributed to:

- 1. A total of 121 new positions were added by Budget Change Proposals effective July 1, 2021.
- 2. The department has specialized, technical positions that require specific licensure and education requirements which lengthen the amount of time to fill positions.
- 3. The department lost 119 positions to The Department of Cannabis Control effective July 12, 2021.
