TAKEMEHOME

HIV Self-Testing in Six California Counties From September 2020 - December 2022

Since September 2020, the California Department of Public Health, Office of AIDS (CDPH/OA) has been partnering with the <u>Building Healthy Online Communities</u>' **TakeMeHome** program.¹ Advertised through gay dating apps and websites, **TakeMeHome** discreetly delivers free, in-home self-test kits to Californians for HIV, sexually transmitted infections (STI), and hepatitis C virus (HCV), without the need to go into a clinic or testing site. Some counties also fund PrEP panels through the **TakeMeHome** program.

This infographic represents data gathered from six California counties, from September 2020 through December 2022.²










Had Never Taken an HIV Test Before Hadn't taken an HIV Test in a Year or More

What's Next?

In January of 2023, CDPH/OA expanded the **TakeMeHome** program to offer free oral swab rapid HIV self-tests to residents in **all** California counties.³

- 1 The TakeMeHome program in California is funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) Ending the HIV Epidemic (EHE) in America (PS20-2010) grant and administered by CDPH/OA.
- 2 The EHE grant funds six California Consortium counties: Alameda, Orange, Riverside, Sacramento, San Bernardino, and San Diego.
 In December 2021, the program was expanded to also offer self-collected kits with both swab and dried blood-spot for HIV, syphilis, gonorrhea, chlamydia, hepatitis C virus, and creatinine, which are mailed-in to a lab for testing. - 3 Los Angeles and San Francisco are directly funded by the CDC to provide similar programs in their respective counties; therefore, their data is not represented in this infographic.
