Environmental Health Training in Emergency Response (EHTER) San Diego June 26-27, 2012 8am-5pm

This course is based on material created by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and hosted by the National Environmental Health Association and the California Department of Public Health.

The purpose of this 2-day Awareness Level course is to increase the emergency preparedness and response capabilities of public health and environmental health practitioners by providing the necessary knowledge and skills to address the environmental health impacts of emergencies and disasters.

Topics covered will include the role of the environmental health specialist related to emergency management, responder safety, food and drinking water supplies, shelter sanitation, debris management, wastewater and hazardous materials.

The EHTER course offers sixteen (16) hours of Continuing Education credit for the California Registered Environmental Health Specialist (REHS) provided through the National Environmental Health Association (NEHA).*

No lunch is provided. Daily parking fees apply.


