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Your Environmental Health Specialist Registration will expire on December 31, 2007. On the back of this page is the Registered Environmental Health Specialist (REHS) biennial renewal application. California Health and Safety Code (HSC) Section 106700 requires a biennial renewal fee of \$175 to be paid by each REHS on or before the first day of January every other year.

Please make your check or money order payable to the **Environmental Health Specialist Registration Fund** and mail it with this form in the enclosed envelope. If your registration is paid by a third party such as a county treasurer, please make sure that the check and the renewal form are mailed to the correct address identified on the renewal form.

If you do not pay your renewal fee by January 1, 2008, your registration will be suspended and invalid. A penalty of \$87.50 will be charged if the renewal fee is not postmarked on or before January 31, 2008. The penalty will continue to accrue for each year or portion thereof that the renewal fee is not paid. If you have not paid the fees and associated penalties within three years, your registration will be revoked. A registration that has been revoked may not be revalidated, and a new application must be filed for registration. You will also need to meet all current requirements and pass the REHS examination.
