


Focus Area 4: Chronic Kidney Disease


Objective 4-5. Increase the proportion of dialysis patients registered on the waiting list for transplantation. Target = 30.0 percent (ages under 70 years) [State Data Source: U.S. Renal Data System (USRDS), NIH, NIDDK]

California data available from the USRDS indicate that 25.0 percent of dialysis patients under 70 years of age were registered on waiting lists for kidney transplantation in the year 2004 (**Figure 4-5.1**). Although this represents an absolute increase of 3.4 percent from the 21.6 percent reported for 2000, the HP2010 target of 30.0 percent has not yet been achieved for Californians.



Data by gender (**Figure 4-5.1**) show significantly higher percentages of male dialysis patients under 70 years of age on kidney transplant waiting lists than females, with trends significantly increasing toward the HP2010 target for both genders.

Data by race and ethnicity (Figure 4-5.2) show the HP2010 target being achieved only for California's Asian or Pacific Islander population (37.8 percent in 2004). No significant trends were found for any of the other racial or ethnic populations, and this HP2010 objective has not yet been achieved for Whites (26.3 percent in 2004), American Indians or Alaska Natives (AIAN) (24.2 percent in 2004), Blacks or African Americans (21.6 percent in 2004), or Hispanics or Latinos (20.8 percent in 2004).
