

Technical notes: MIHA is an annual population-based survey of California resident women with a live birth in 2010 with a sample size of 6,817. Percent (%), 95% confidence intervals (95% CI), and estimated population numbers of women with the health indicator/characteristic (i.e., numerator of the percent rounded to the nearest hundred) are weighted to represent all women with a live birth in California and the county in 2010. Indicator definitions are on the MIHA website.
