CITATION FOR NONCOMPLIANCE

With Title 22 of the California Code of Regulations Section 64426.1

Section 116650 of the California Health and Safety Code (CHSC), authorizes the issuance of a citation for failure to comply with a requirement of California Safe Drinking Water Act (CHSC, Division 104, Part 12, Chapter 4, commencing with Section 116270), or any regulation, standard, permit or order issued thereunder.

The Division of Drinking Water and Environmental Management of the State of California Department of Public Health (Department) hereby issues a citation to the NPS-Glen & Wildcat Campgrounds (System) for failure to

1 comply with Title 22, California Code of Regulations (CCR) Section 64426.1
2 in December 2012 and June 2013.

4 **APPLICABLE AUTHORITIES**

5
6 Section 116650 of the CHSC states in relevant part:

7

9 (a) If the department determines that a public water system is in violation of this
10 chapter or any regulation, permit, standard, citation, or order issued or adopted
11 thereunder, the department may issue a citation to the public water system.
12 The citation shall be served upon the public water system personally or by
13 certified mail. Service shall be deemed effective as of the date of personal
14 service or the date of receipt of the certified mail. If a person to whom a citation
15 is directed refuses to accept delivery of the certified mail, the date of service
16 shall be deemed to be the date of mailing.

17
18 (b) Each citation shall be in writing and shall describe the nature of the violation or
19 violations, including a reference to the statutory provision, standard, order,
20 citation, permit, or regulation alleged to have been violated.

21
22 (c) A citation may specify a date for elimination or correction of the condition
23 constituting the violation.

24
25 (d) A citation may include the assessment of a penalty as specified in subdivision
26 (e).

27 (e) The department may assess a penalty in an amount not to exceed one
thousand dollars (\$1,000) per day for each day that a violation occurred, and



1 for each day that a violation continues to occur. A separate penalty may be
2 assessed for each violation.

4 California Code of Regulations (CCR), Section 64426.1 states in relevant
5 part:

6 (b) A public water system is in violation of the total coliform MCL {maximum
7 contaminant level} when any of the following occurs:

8 (1) For a public water system which collects at least 40 samples per
9 month, more than 5.0 percent of the samples collected during any
10 month are total coliform-positive; or

11 (2) For a public water system which collects fewer than 40 samples per
12 month, more than one sample collected during any month is total
13 coliform-positive; or

14 (3) Any repeat sample is fecal coliform-positive or E. coli-positive; or

15 (4) Any repeat sample following a fecal coliform-positive or E. coli-positive
16 routine sample is total coliform-positive.

17
18 **STATEMENT OF FACTS**

19 The Department has received laboratory results for twelve bacteriological
20 samples collected during June 2013 from the System. All samples were
21 analyzed for the presence of coliform bacteria. Two of the twelve samples
22 tested positive for coliform bacteria.

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25 The Department received results for nine bacteriological samples collected
26 during December 2012 from the System. All samples were analyzed for the
27 presence of coliform bacteria. Two of the nine samples tested positive for
coliform bacteria.



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DETERMINATIONS

THE DEPARTMENT HAS DETERMINED:

The System violated Title 22 of the CCR, Section 64426.1, in that the System failed to comply with the maximum contaminant level (MCL) for total coliform bacteria during the months of June 2013 and December 2012.

PENALTIES PURSUANT TO HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE SECTION

116650

The Department hereby assesses upon System a penalty in the amount of \$100.00. Directions for paying this penalty are included in Directive 4 of this citation.

DIRECTIVES

NPS-Glen & Wildcat Campgrounds is hereby directed to take the following actions:

1. Comply with Section 64426.1, Title 22, of the California Code of Regulations in all future monitoring periods.

1 2. Notify all persons served by the System of the MCL violation in
2 conformance with Section 64463.4 and 64465, Title 22 of the CCR,
3 and as follows:

4
5 a) Completion of Attachment A to include the name, address, and
6 telephone number of a System representative as a source of
7 additional information concerning the public notice. **You must**
8 **also give a legible, written description (preferably typed) of**
9 **the corrective actions taken by the water system to prevent**
10 **this violation from occurring in the future. You must use the**
11 **space provided in Attachment A for this written description.**

12
13
14 b) Post the notice contained in Attachment A, **after it has been**
15 **completed in accordance with (a) above**, in conspicuous
16 locations throughout the area served by the System. Posting
17 must begin no later than **September 23, 2013** and must continue
18 for seven days.

21 c) Publish the notice contained in Attachment A, **after it has been**
22 **completed in accordance with (a) above**, in a local newspaper
23 of general circulation in the area served by the System (or weekly
24 newspaper if no daily paper is available) for one day. The
25 publication in a local newspaper must be completed by
26 **September 23, 2013.**

1 d) Provide public notice for this violation in accordance with Section
2 64465(c), Title 22 or the CCR, which requires for each non-
3 English speaking group that exceeds 1,000 residents or 10% of
4 the residents in a community (whichever is less) that the public
5 notice contain information in the appropriate language(s)
6 regarding the importance of the notice, or contain a telephone
7 number or address where such residents may contact the water
8 system to receive a translated copy of the notice or to receive
9 assistance in the appropriate language.
10

12 3. Pursuant to Section 64424(d), Title 22 of the CCR, the System shall
13 collect five (5) routine bacteriological samples by **September 20,**
14 **2013.** The results of these samples shall be submitted with the
15 attached Compliance Certification form.
16

18 4. Submit to the Department by **September 30, 2013,** a check for the
19 penalty of \$100.00 imposed by this Citation and a copy of the form
20 which is attached hereto entitled "Notice of Citation Issuance." The
21 Citation number shall be written on the check. The check shall be
22 made payable to the **California Department of Public Health Safe**
23 **Drinking Water Account** and submitted to:

1 5. The System shall complete the attached Compliance Certification
2 form and return it to the Department within 10 days of the public
3 notice being posted in the system in no case later than **September**
4 **30, 2013. A copy of the notice published in the newspaper, a**
5 **copy of the notice posted in conspicuous locations, and a copy**
6 **of the laboratory results must be attached to the form.**
7

9 The Department reserves the right to make such modifications to this
10 Citation as it may deem necessary to protect public health and safety. Such
11 modifications may be issued as amendments to this Citation and shall be
12 effective upon issuance.
13

15 Nothing in this Citation relieves the System of its obligation to meet the
16 requirements of the California Safe Drinking Water Act (CHSC, Division 104,
17 Part 12, Chapter 4, commencing with Section 116270), or any regulation,
18 standard, permit or order issued thereunder.

This Citation shall apply to and be binding upon the System, its officers, directors, agents, employees, contractors, successors, and assignees.

SEVERABILITY

The directives of this Citation are severable, and the System shall comply with each and every provision thereof notwithstanding the effectiveness of any provision.



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FURTHER ENFORCEMENT ACTION

Division 104, Part 12, Chapter 4, (commencing with Section 116270) of the California Health and Safety Code authorizes the Department to: issue additional citations with assessment of penalties if the System continues to fail to correct a violation identified in a citation; take action to suspend or revoke a permit that has been issued to a public water system if the System has violated applicable law or regulations or has failed to comply with orders of the Department; and petition the superior court to take various enforcement measures against a public water system that has failed to comply with orders of the Department. The Department does not waive any further enforcement action by issuance of this citation.

Disclosure: Be advised that Section 116725 and 116730 of the California Health and Safety Code states that any person who knowingly makes any false statement on any report or document submitted for the purpose of compliance with the attached order may be liable for a civil penalty not to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for each separate violation for each day that violation continues. In addition, the violators may be prosecuted in criminal court and upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not more than \$25,000 for each day of violation, or be imprisoned in county jail not to exceed one year, or by both the fine and imprisonment.

NPS-Glen & Wildcat Campgrounds Had Levels of Coliform Bacteria Above the Drinking Water Standard During June 2013

Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we did to correct the situation. Please share this information with other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly. You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or giving out copies by hand or mail.

What happened?

We routinely monitor our drinking water for contaminants. We took twelve water samples to test for the presence of coliform bacteria during June 2013. Two of our samples showed the presence of coliform bacteria. The standard is that no more than 1 sample per month may test positive for bacteria. The positive samples were tested further for fecal coliform. **No fecal coliform or E. coli were found.** However, our drinking water exceeded the maximum contaminant level allowed for total coliform bacteria, as specified in Section 64426.1, Title 22 of the California Code of Regulations (CCR).

What does this mean?

The California Department of Public Health (Department) sets drinking water standards and has determined that the presence of total coliform bacteria is a possible health concern. Coliforms are bacteria that are naturally present in the environment and are used as an indicator that other, potentially harmful, bacteria may be present. Coliforms were found in more drinking water samples than allowed. This was a warning of potential problems and a violation of the regulations.

What should I do?

This is not an emergency. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately.

People with severely compromised immune systems, infants, and some elderly may be at increased risk. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. General guidelines on ways to lessen the risk of infection by microbes are available from EPA's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at (800) 426-4791.

If you have other health concerns related to the consumption of this water, you may wish to consult your doctor.

Has the problem been resolved? What corrective actions have been taken to prevent this violation from occurring in the future?

This notification of the public is being done in compliance with Section 64463.4, Title 22 of the CCR as a means of keeping the public informed.
