Kaiser, Dr Brockhurst	<p>ASQ-MCHAT developmental screening program:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Providing services in 5 Kaiser service areas- Sac, So. Sac, Fresno, Stockton, Vallejo or 40% of pediatric population, about 200 pediatricians. Will expand to the 60% of the region within the next year.</li> <li>- Pediatricians use tools when well child visit milestone are not met, when concern, high risk for delay or autism or any failed universal screening for development.</li> <li>- Family gets ASQ-3 or MCHAT in Spanish or English. Mail in to score, and parents get results. Plan developed with regional center or school. Marin county also using tools.</li> </ul>	Let Resource and Referral agencies know about this
Update on Reimbursement under Medi-Cal	Dr. Wachtel provided PowerPoint presentation and clarification on background and what exists currently on 96110 and 96111 differences (96111 is more labor intensive service). Refer to handout. Also discussed clinical requirements for documentation: record of the instrument used, date, results and action taken and clear process for reimbursement that is easy.	<p>Follow-up at next meeting:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Follow-up on possible resource materials and training strategies on use of proper CPT codes, who can be reimbursed (RN's, PHN's, MSW's, etc) and roles of SSC representatives in next steps</li> <li>- Pat Sardo, DHCS will send link to CCS resource that identifies codes and who can bill.</li> </ul>

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	<p>Navid Sabati of DHCS presented key findings in the effort to clarify the process for Medi-Cal reimbursement including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- frequency allowed</li> <li>- who can bill</li> <li>- documentation needed for billing</li> <li>- medical environments and local education agencies process for billing, rate differentials</li> <li>- electronic vs mail-in billing processes under consideration.</li> </ul> <p>Currently, local codes are being transformed into national CPT and adjustments are still being determined</p>	
<p>Update from Healthy Families and the Survey of Plans</p>	<p>Ruth Jacobs, MRMIB provided a brief overview of the systems – including determining eligibility for CCS services and county mental health services in coordination with child’s primary health plan. Children with developmental disability would be in CCS plan.</p> <p>Initial summary of survey findings from plans regarding screening:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Workgroup created brief survey and had significant responses - 25 plans responded</li> <li>- Some key findings: 800,000 children in Healthy Families; only 1.26% were screened,</li> <li>- Mostly during well child visits.
