New Business

Teen Pregnancy Prevention Annual Conference:

The Teen Pregnancy Prevention Annual Conference for Fiscal Year 2009-2010 has been cancelled. If you would like to revise your budget to reallocate these funds for other training opportunities, please contact your Contract Manager (CM) as soon as possible.

Information and Education (I & E) Program Update:

1. The Office of Family Planning (OFP) is preparing a Request for Application (RFA) for the I & E Program for the next grant term beginning July 1, 2011. Additional details regarding the release of the RFA will be forthcoming and posted on this website.
2. The Fiscal Year (FY) 2010-2011 I&E Agreement Funding Application (AFA) Negotiation meetings will be conducted June 7, 2010 through June 17, 2010.
3. The designated FY 2009-2010 Fourth Quarter Time Study Period for I&E Grantees was the first week of May, beginning May 3, 2010, and scheduled for five (5) consecutive days. The time study is required for all I&E staff that are drawing down Title XIX funding. I&E Grantees should submit staff time study summary sheets with their Fourth Quarter invoices.

California Family PACT Program Averts Record Number of Unintended Pregnancies in 2007

OFP and the University of California at San Francisco have released the Cost-Benefit Analysis of the California Family PACT Program for Calendar Year 2007 report. CPI will be implemented in the last half of FY 2009-2010 and **reported in the Year End Progress Report** under Section D "TPP Evaluation Activities", due August 2, 2010, using the following guidelines:

- Choose a CPI Tool that your agency previously implemented. The intent is to re-evaluate an area previously reviewed by the CPI process. Consult with your assigned Program Consultant (PC) to ensure you choose the most appropriate CPI Tool.
- Re-implement the CPI Tool and gather/analyze data.
- In the **CPI Evaluation Narrative** of Section D "TPP Evaluation Activities" please state: *'see the attached CPI Summary.'*
- Attach the CPI Summary (do not include surveys or other supplemental documentation) to the FY 2009-2010 Year End Progress Report under Section D "TPP Evaluation Activities".
