CPI will be implemented in the last half of FY 2009-10 and reported in the Year End Progress Report according to the following guidelines:

- Choose a CPI Tool that your agency previously implemented. The intent is to re-evaluate an area previously reviewed by the CPI process. Consult with your assigned Program Consultant (PC) to ensure you choose the most appropriate CPI Tool.
- Re-implement the CPI Tool and gather/analyze data.
- Report findings in the CPI Summary section (Attachment 6) of the 2009-2010 Year End Progress Report due Monday, August 2, 2010 as August 1 falls on a Sunday. (When the due date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, the next business day is considered to be the last timely date.)
