# NEOPB SNAP-Ed Staffing

- Budget Change Proposal
  - For 45 positions
    - 40 for CDPH-NEOPB SNAP-Ed program and funded by USDA
    - 100% of the BCP positions are currently filled
- FFY 2016 NEOPB SNAP-Ed FTE State Positions = 97.04
  - FFY 2015: 106.60 (state positions)
  - FFY 2014: 137.80 [70.30 (state positions) + 67.50 (contract positions)]



# Transitional Contracts

## Non-Competitive Bid (NCB) Contract - Public Health Institute (PHI)

- **Contract Ended:** 9/30/2015
- **Key Activities:**
  - Mentor new CDPH-NEOPB staff; knowledge transfer
  - Develop intervention toolkits, guides, and training manuals
  - Create and deliver training modules and coaching sessions
  - Respond to various technical assistance requests
- NEOPB staff training is continuous and extends beyond the NCB contract. As NEOPB receives new information, existing subject matter experts, as well as new staff, will receive training and support to continue to build staff expertise and capacity.

# FFY 2016 SNAP-Ed State Plan - STATE

- **CA Plan Approved on September 30, 2015**
  - Overall Plan Approval Rate = 99.5%
  - California Approx. = \$115.9 M
- **CDPH-NEOPB Allocation = \$96.8 M (≈ 83%)**
  - \$7.8M reduction = 8.5% (from FFY 2015)
  - ≈ 86.7% of total funds is contracted (≈ \$83.9M)




# Multi-Year SNAP-Ed Planning

- Starting in FFY 2017, California will submit a three-year SNAP-Ed State Plan to USDA/WRO; this is a FIRST for California
- Allows California to develop longer-term objectives to work toward significant community change
- LIAs will submit a three-year IWP for FFY 2017–2019
- SIAs are engaged on what this change means to both state and local partners and are planning training and technical assistance opportunities accordingly

# NEOP Portfolios – LIVE, LEARN, SHOP, WORK

- Five Portfolios based on the setting categories described in the USDA Western Regional SNAP-Ed Evaluation Framework
- Intended to help guide the LHDs to prepare for their three-year IWPs and to generate their LHD SOW
- Intervention approaches from the social ecological model (SEM)
- Resources and activity examples provided






