OVERVIEW

Disparities exist in the delivery of care and treatment for women with HIV infection, particularly for racial minorities. This course is designed to provide health care professionals with increased knowledge on best evidence-based medicine and practice protocols related to patient-centered, sex-specific comprehensive care that decreases barriers among minorities and women.

The TX/OK AETC has developed the **Women & HIV On-Line Self Study Modules**, which consist of four online modules presented by clinicians who provide treatment to women infected with HIV. These modules feature an interactive, web-based approach to learning.

TARGET AUDIENCE

The modules are targeted at **novice level clinicians** in HIV care, including:

- Physicians
- Physician Assistants
- Nurses
- Social Workers
- Other health care professionals.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Attendees will gain effective strategies to address issues specific to women who present with HIV infection. The ultimate goal of this continuing education activity is to enhance the capacity of physicians and other health care professionals to provide quality health care for women with HIV.
