### **OVERVIEW**

- Assess symptoms, diagnose and determine treatment options for females at risk for Chlamydia, gonorrhea and syphilis.
- Summarize the 2006 CDC recommendations for routine HIV testing and how they differ from previous HIV testing recommendations.
- Distinguish the difference between conventional vs. rapid HIV testing.
- Identify a minimum of three barriers to HIV testing from each of the following perspectives; client, system, and provider.
