The President is listening, Make Your Voice Heard!

President Obama is committed to developing a National AIDS Strategy to better coordinate the U.S. response to its domestic epidemic and to focus on three key goals:

- Reducing new HIV infections
- Getting all HIV+ people into appropriate care and treatment
- Reducing racial and gender disparities in HIV/AIDS

The specifics of the National AIDS Strategy are not yet determined, so now is the time for us to provide input about what we would like to see. It is important that the President hears from people across the country, including people most affected by HIV/AIDS, who can share ideas of what works and what is needed based on local experience.

Top White House staff will be at our Community Discussion to listen:

- Jeff Crowley, White House Dir. of the Office of National AIDS Policy [ONAP];
- Greg Millett, a CDC researcher serving as the ONAP Senior Policy Advisor; and
- James Albino, ONAP Senior Program Manager and former Director of Advocacy at the Hispanic Federation.

They are coming from DC to SF and then will be back for another discussion in Oakland.
