SUBJECT:                            BREASTFEEDING PROMOTION

**Purpose**

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) encourages all labor and delivery facilities to utilize their exclusive breastfeeding initiation rates as part of their Quality Improvement measures. We are offering assistance in developing hospital policies that will increase exclusive breastfeeding rates in the early post-partum period.

**Exclusive Breastfeeding**

In the last two years, both the American Academy of Pediatrics and the American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology have published well-documented statements clearly endorsing exclusive breastfeeding as the optimal way to nourish and care for infants. Proof of the value and importance of breastfeeding is evident when researchers study the effects of “exclusive” breastfeeding. A full-term infant’s gut and immune systems are not designed to have contact with non-human factors, such as proteins and enzymes, until it is mature. Infants that have been born too soon or too weak especially require breast milk to assist in gut maturity and increased immune protection along with appropriate nutrition and treatment for their conditions.

**Hospital Breastfeeding Data and Disparities**

In 2006, over 86 percent of California women initiated breastfeeding while in the hospital, yet less than 43 percent breastfed exclusively. Enclosed are 2006 in-hospital breastfeeding data tables, which were created using data collected from the Genetic Disease Screening Program’s Newborn Screening Test Form (DHS 4409). These tables allow you to examine the percent of women who initiate breastfeeding at your hospital in comparison to other hospitals in your county, the State and county rates (Enclosure A). These data should not be compared to data provided in prior years as there has been a change in the methodology for computing these rates. Breastfeeding data tables for prior years, which have been revised using this new methodology, and breastfeeding data by

race/ethnicity, are available on the web at  
<http://www.cdph.ca.gov/data/statistics/Pages/BreastfeedingStatistics.aspx>.

For many years, hospital breastfeeding data has shown a disparity in exclusive breastfeeding rates between white mothers and those of other race/ethnicities. White mothers exclusively breastfeed at a higher rate, thereby reducing their infants' health risks. Hospitals can address this disparity by providing culturally and linguistically appropriate staff and support. In addition, mothers should be linked in a timely manner to community programs using culturally appropriate breastfeeding support, such as the Black Infant Health Program, Adolescent Family Life Program, and the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program (Enclosure B). Many WIC agencies can also assist low-income mothers when they need additional interventions such as the assistance of a Lactation Consultant or the use of a breast pump.

### **Resources to Promote In-Hospital Breastfeeding**

We realize that evidence-based care is the goal for all California hospitals. The CDPH breastfeeding website <http://www.cdph.ca.gov/programs/BreastFeeding/Pages/default.aspx> has a variety of resources, such as the 2005 Model Hospital Policy Recommendations, that list specific actions that have been proven to increase exclusive breastfeeding in hospitals. Hospitals that implement the model policies help their patients learn how to care for their babies, initiate lactation and access community services that will support them once they are discharged. An internet-based toolkit is also available to assist in implementing these policies. The toolkit includes information, such as sample policies and chart reviews, as well as links to state, national and international professional resources for practical steps to accomplish gradual policy changes.

The Regional Perinatal Programs of California (RPPC), a network of regional medical consultants that promote access to risk appropriate perinatal care for pregnant women and their infants, are locally available to assist hospitals in implementing optimal breastfeeding services. These consultants have access to breastfeeding materials, information and technical assistance from the CDPH. Attached (Enclosure C) is the current contact information for the RPPC Coordinator for each Region. In addition, the CDPH urges all labor and delivery facilities to coordinate with their local breastfeeding coalition listed under Data, Resources and Links in the Breastfeeding Program Page <http://www.cdph.ca.gov/programs/BreastFeeding/Pages/default.aspx> to address barriers to women exclusively breastfeeding.

### **Success Stories**

Eighteen of the 61 labor and delivery facilities in the United States that have earned the designation of "Baby Friendly" as defined by the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF)'s Baby Friendly Hospital Initiative are from California. Enclosed is


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information on this program and the names of the California facilities with this prestigious designation (Enclosure D). Once hospitals have implemented the California Model Hospital Policy Recommendations, they will find that they can also meet most of the requirements for this international recognition.

### **Closing**

The CDPH is interested in developing a partnership with California hospitals and health care providers to increase exclusive breastfeeding, not only at hospital discharge, but into the first year of life. Most mothers that choose to exclusively breastfeed on admission will do so during their hospital stay if the hospital environment supports this through policy and practice. In this way hospitals can dramatically increase exclusive breastfeeding rates. Once a high exclusive breastfeeding rate is initiated in the hospitals, followed by appropriate referrals to and collaboration with other agencies serving women and infants, California will be able to meet the Healthy People 2010 exclusive breastfeeding goals of 60 percent at three months and 25 percent at six months.

Use the enclosed data to identify how successful your facility is in promoting and supporting breastfeeding, and take advantage of our offer to assist you with any policy revisions you are interested in pursuing. Working together we can take steps towards a more breastfeeding friendly hospital environment and ultimately improve the health of generations of Californians.

## **What is the Baby-Friendly Hospital Initiative and why do we need it?**

More than one million infants worldwide die every year because they are not breastfed or are given other foods too early. Millions more live in poor health, contract preventable diseases, and battle malnutrition. Although the magnitude of this death and disease is far greater in the developing world, thousands of infants in the United States suffer the ill effects of an infant formula-feeding culture. A decreased risk of diarrhea, respiratory and ear infections, and allergic skin disorders are among the many benefits of breastfeeding to infants in the industrialized world.

In the United States, these benefits could translate into millions of dollars of savings to our health care system through decreased hospitalizations and pediatric clinic visits. For diarrhea alone, approximately 200,000 US children, most of whom are young infants, are hospitalized each year at a cost of more than half a billion dollars. Many of these cases of diarrhea could have been prevented with breastfeeding. In a study of the morbidity in an affluent US population, Dewey and colleagues found that the reduction in morbidity in breastfed babies was of sufficient magnitude to be of public significance. For example, the incidence of prolonged episodes of otitis media (ear infections) was 80% lower in breastfed as compared to non-breastfed infants. The cost savings to the health care system could be enormous if breastfeeding duration increased, given that ear infections alone cost billions of dollars a year.

It is a rare exception when a woman cannot breastfeed her baby for physical or medical reasons. Yet, a woman's ability to feel self confident and secure with her decision to breastfeed is challenged by her family and friends, the media, and health care providers. Much has been done in the past few years to strengthen the sources of support for women to breastfeed. However, no comprehensive national program has existed that focused on the efforts of hospitals and birthing centers. Although the hospital is not and should not be the only place a mother receives support for breastfeeding, hospitals provide a unique and critical link between the breastfeeding support provided prior to and after delivery.

The Baby-Friendly Hospital Initiative (BFHI) is a global program sponsored by the World Health Organization (WHO) and the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) to encourage and recognize hospitals and birthing centers that offer an optimal level of care for lactation. The BFHI assists hospitals in giving breastfeeding mothers the information, confidence, and skills needed to successfully initiate and continue breastfeeding their babies and gives special recognition to hospitals that have done so.

### **BFHI IN THE U.S.**

Baby-Friendly USA is the national authority for the BFHI in the United States. In 1992, the Healthy Mothers, Healthy Babies Coalition received a grant from the US Department of Health and Human Services to convene an Expert Work Group to examine the criteria and assessment process of the global BFHI. Wellstart International, which is located in San Diego, California, developed the evaluation materials to support the assessment process. The U.S. Committee for UNICEF supported these efforts financially and with "in kind" services. In January of 1997, Healthy Children Project, Inc. accepted responsibility for the initiative and worked to form Baby-Friendly USA as the non-profit organization, which now implements the Baby-Friendly Hospital Initiative in the United States.

## **The Ten Steps To Successful Breastfeeding**

The BFHI promotes, protects, and supports breastfeeding through The Ten Steps to Successful Breastfeeding for Hospitals, as outlined by UNICEF/WHO. The steps for the United States are:

1. Maintain a written breastfeeding policy that is routinely communicated to all health care staff.
2. Train all health care staff in skills necessary to implement this policy.
3. Inform all pregnant women about the benefits and management of breastfeeding.
4. Help mothers initiate breastfeeding within one hour of birth.
5. Show mothers how to breastfeed and how to maintain lactation, even if they are separated from their infants.
6. Give infants no food or drink other than breastmilk, unless medically indicated.
7. Practice “rooming in”-- allow mothers and infants to remain together 24 hours a day.
8. Encourage unrestricted breastfeeding.
9. Give no pacifiers or artificial nipples to breastfeeding infants.
10. Foster the establishment of breastfeeding support groups and refer mothers to them on discharge from the hospital or clinic.
