# Legislative Report

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# Success Rates\*

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- Sponsored Bills: 100%
  - (1 bill)
- Cosponsored Bills: 100%
  - (1 bill)
- Opposed Bills: 100% in our favor
  - (5 bills)
- Supported Bills: 82%
  - (22 bills; 18 successful)

\*Covers success up to governor's desk

# Bills Sent to the Governor

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- SB 1038 (Allen): TB testing
  - HOAC Sponsored
  - Signed into law
- AB 1554 (Irwin) and SB 819 (Huff): Powdered Alcohol
  - HOAC Cosponsored

# Supported Bills Sent to the Governor

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- **AB 470 (Chu): Residential swimming pools**
  - Requires home inspections to include pool safety
  - Requires two safety features instead of just one
  - Allows door alarms to issue a verbal warning
  - Applies to new construction only
- **AB 1546 (Olsen): Vital Records**
  - Allows state registrar to suspend certain safety feature requirements in an emergency
  - Requires study of security features in addition to intaglio print
  - Signed into law

# Supported Bills Sent to Governor

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- AB 2722 (Burke) Transformative Climate Communities
  - Signed into law
  - Uses Cap & Trade funds
  - Creates program in the Strategic Growth Council
  - Will fund and oversee neighborhood level community plans
  - Local health departments are eligible for funds
  - May prioritize disadvantaged communities
  - Must prioritize reduction of GHGs

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- AB 1696 (Holden) Medi-Cal Tobacco Cessation
- AB 1763 (Gipson) Colo-Rectal Cancer Screening
- AB 2083 (Chu) Interagency Child Death Review
- AB 2179 (Gipson) Hepatitis C Testing
- AB 2892 (Committee on ESTM) Pesticide Poisoning Reporting

# Supported Bills Sent to the Governor

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- SB 32 (Pavley) Greenhouse gas emissions
- SB 877 (Pan) Reporting and tracking of violent deaths
- SB 1238 (Pan) Inmate research papers
- SB 1380 (Mitchell) Homeless Coordinating and Financing Council
- SB 1383 (Lara) Short-Lived Climate Pollutants

# \$900 Million Cap & Trade Deal

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- \$140m in grants to high-pollution communities
- Urban forests
- Active transportation
- Clean vehicle programs
- Clean heavy-duty vehicle programs
- Reducing methane from livestock
- Biomass energy (see tree death)
- \$2m for TA to disadvantaged communities

# Supported Bill Deaths

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- AB 2424 (Gomez) Wellness Fund
  - Died in Senate Appropriations Committee
- AB 2782 (Bloom) Soda Tax
  - Died in Assembly Health Committee

# Other Supported Bill Deaths

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- AB 2796 (Bloom) Active Transportation Program
  - Died in Senate Appropriations Committee
- SB 1223 (Huff) Provisional Drivers Licenses to 21
  - Died in Assembly Appropriations Committee

# Opposed Bill Outcomes

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- AB 45 (Mullin) Household Hazardous Waste
  - Died in Senate Environmental Quality Committee
- AB 2593 (Brown) Home Food Facilities
  - Died in Assembly Health Committee
- SB 476 (Mendoza) Day Camps
  - Died in Assembly Appropriations

# Opposed Bill Outcomes

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- SB 1246 (Nguyen) Aerial Spraying
  - Died in Senate Environmental Quality Committee
- AB 1732 (Ting) Single-User Restrooms
  - Amended to remove health officer from bill

# Leg Process and Health Equity

## ALL BILLS

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- HOAC Tracked 933 bills
- CCLHO considered 62 bills
- CCLHO supported 22 bills


## HEALTH EQUITY BILLS

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- HOAC Tracked 354 health equity bills
- CCLHO considered 12 health equity bills
- CCLHO supported 6 health equity bills


# Bills Referred for Position

- Small Jurisdictions: 4
- Data: 5
- Emergency Preparedness: 6
- CD: 7
- EH: 18
- Chronic Disease: 28



# Bills with Positions

- Small Jurisdictions: 0 out of 4 (0%)
- Data: 4 out of 5 (80%)
- Emergency Preparedness: 1 out of 6 (17%)
- CD: 3 out of 7 (43%)
- EH: 6 out of 18 (33%)
- Chronic Disease: 15 out of 28 (54%)
