AB 339	<p>Sales of animals at swap meets (Dickinson)</p> <p>Existing law generally regulates the operation of swap meets, flea markets, and open-air markets where personal property is exchanged, sold, or offered for sale or exchange. Existing law also regulates food vendors operating at swap meets.</p> <p>This bill would authorize, subject to exceptions and commencing January 1, 2016, a swap meet operator to permit a vendor to offer animals for sale at a swap meet provided the local jurisdiction has adopted certain standards for the care and treatment of those animals during the time that the animals are present at the swap meet and transported to and from the swap meet.</p>	<p>LAST HIST. AB 446	<p>HIV Testing (Mitchell)</p> <p>This bill would delete the requirement that the medical care provider provide a patient with information about the HIV test, the treatment options, and the advisability of continued testing. The bill would also delete the requirement for a written statement of informed consent. The bill would require an HIV test to be performed for each draw of blood that is ordered for a patient in the emergency department of a general acute care hospital, a public health clinic, or an urgent care center, provided that the patient has consented and would require the results of the HIV test to be given to the patient before he or she leave the facility unless he or she leaves before being released.</p>	<p>LAST HIST. SB 249	<p>Public health: health records: confidentiality (Leno)</p> <p>Under the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA), each state is required to, by January 1, 2014, establish an American Health Benefit Exchange that makes available qualified health plans to qualified individuals and small employers.</p> <p>The bill would authorize the State Department of Public Health, subject to specified provisions, to share health records involving the diagnosis, care, and treatment of HIV or AIDS related to a beneficiary enrolled in federal Ryan White Act-funded programs who may be eligible for services under the PPACA with participating entities, as defined, in health care coverage expansions under the PPACA. SB 294	<p>Expansion of Provisions to Assure the Safety of Compounded Pharmaceutical Products (Emmerson)</p> <p>The Pharmacy Law provides for the licensure and regulation of pharmacists and pharmacy corporations in this state by the California State Board of Pharmacy. Existing law requires the board to adopt regulations establishing standards for compounding injectable sterile drug products in a pharmacy. Existing law requires pharmacies to obtain a license from the board, subject to annual renewal, in order to compound injectable sterile drug products. A similar licensing requirement applies to nonresident pharmacies compounding injectable sterile drug products for shipment into California. A violation of the Pharmacy Law is a crime.</p> <p>This bill would expand these provisions to prohibit a pharmacy from compounding or dispensing, and a nonresident pharmacy from compounding for shipment into this state, sterile drug products for injection, administration into the eye, or inhalation, unless the pharmacy has obtained a sterile compounding pharmacy license from the board. The bill would specify requirements for the board for issuance or renewal of a license, and requirements for the pharmacy as a licensee. By adding additional requirements to the Pharmacy Law concerning sterile drug products, the violation of which is a crime, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program.</p> <p>99</p>	<p>LAST HIST.
