NETWORK FOR A HEALTHY CALIFORNIA—AFRICAN AMERICAN CAMPAIGN FAITH PROJECTS—REQUEST FOR APPLICATION (RFA) #AARFA-2010

The *Network for a Healthy California (Network)* will be releasing Request for Application (RFA) #AARFA-2010 to award funding to non-profit faith associations (i.e., an existing denominational fellowship of churches or congregations with a hierarchal structure) and faith alliances (i.e., a group of churches formally joined together for the common interest of engaging in some form of community development) to increase the use of effective, innovative nutrition education interventions in faith-based organizations, to encourage daily physical activity, and to promote access to healthy food for low-income African Americans living in California.

Mandatory, Non-Binding Letter of Intent Due Date: April 30, 2010

Application Due Date: May 19, 2010

Funding: The *Network* intends to award two to three Faith Projects at an annual maximum award of \$150,000. Funding for the *African American Campaign* Faith Projects is contingent on the continued availability of funds through the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Education (SNAP-Ed) Plan, and subject to USDA SNAP-Ed Plan Guidance requirements.

Term: October 1, 2010 . September 30, 2013

Goals:

1. To increase daily consumption of fruits and vegetables to recommendations found in the *2010 Dietary Guidelines for Americans*.
2. Increase daily physical activity to a minimum of 30 minutes for adults and a minimum of 60 minutes for children.
3. Increase food security, including full participation in federal nutrition assistance programs by eligible persons, especially SNAP (formerly Food Stamp Program).
4. Work with USDA and other partners toward preventing obesity and other diet and physical activity-related chronic diseases.
