I. CALL TO ORDER  <i>B. Lee</i>	The Antimicrobial Stewardship Subcommittee meeting was held on Wednesday, February 19, 2014, via teleconference.	B. Lee called the meeting to order at 2:00 P.M.	
II. Welcome  <i>B. Lee</i>	Brian Lee welcomed participants to the meeting, and invited all on the call to state their name and institution.		
III. Review of minutes  <i>B. Lee</i>	Minutes from previous meeting held on January 7, 2014 were reviewed.	Minutes approved.	
IV. Update from CDPH: Spotlight on ASP Lanette Corona	<p>Lanette provided a short update on the spotlight for ASP. The spotlight is pretty close to being completed and once completed it will be distributed to IDAC and Pharmacy via listserv.</p> <p>Question regarding what the spotlight includes. The response was that essentially it is ways to gather a couple different ASP to volunteer and be highlighted on the website. Spotlight would serve as a mechanism for disseminating information regarding the three tiers of ASP.</p> <p>CDPH is seeking to target more ID physicians and it was suggested that they reach out to additional listservs.</p>		
V. Discussion Items	<p><u>Proposed stronger statement/recommendation from Antimicrobial Stewardship Subcommittee</u></p> <p>A few questions were asked in regards to the components of ASP. It was clarified that an institution would have to fulfill each of the components in order to meet the tier's requirements.</p> <p>In addition, the basic tier would be the minimum requirement and reporting would be made mandatory.</p> <p>Brian Lee reviewed the proposed statement and the floor was opened up for comments.</p> <p>Committee members were asked how they would like to move forward with the proposed</p>	Statement as written approved.	

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	<p>statement, and the statement as written was approved. It was noted that the subcommittee is currently unclear regarding how much of what is written in the statement is enforceable.</p> <p>Committee members are in agreement that this statement can be moved forward and presented to the HAI-AC.</p> <p><u>Additional ways of promoting antimicrobial stewardship in California</u></p> <p>It was suggested that we publicize antibiotic resistance related deaths. It was also suggested that we include a quiz with the case study that we present.</p> <p>The idea of a creating a student directed video as a method of raising of awareness was presented to committee members.</p> <p>It was also suggested that we tag on to what the public education committee is working on. One idea was that committee members take a look at the CDPH education page and brainstorm ideas of what committee members would like to see featured on the site.</p> <p>Question in regards to whether or not CDPH partners up with any news outlets. Response from Lanette was that we must receive approval from OPAA before reaching out to the media.</p> <p>Brian Lee mentioned that the website could also be used as an avenue for disseminating information about the three tiers as well.</p> <p>One challenge that was mentioned is how to go about reaching outpatient physicians. In addition another concern was how to influence hospitalists. In response to the latter, a quick search of the web did show that there does seem to be some antimicrobial stewardship activity within the hospitalist community.</p>	<p>For the next meeting, committee members were charged to look at the CDPH website and to brainstorm a list of links and/or resources that we might like to include on the site. Members were also asked to think about if any of their patients have compelling stories that we may want to feature on the site.</p>	

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	<p>Further, if we were to bring the tiers to a hospitalist association how would this information be disseminated? For example, via seminar, etc. The thought that we may want to act locally, and present some of this information with a local face.</p> <p>It was also mentioned that antibiotic stewardship is beginning to be implemented in medical education presented to students. Will continue this discussion at the next meeting on 3/27/2014.</p>
