


Non-Fatal Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses Reported by Employers

Thousands of workers are injured each day in the United States. The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) Annual Survey of Occupational Injuries and Illnesses provides an estimate of non-fatal occupational injury and illness rates based on a nationwide survey of a sample of employer establishments. It is well recognized that the Annual Survey has a number of limitations and underestimates the full extent of the problem. Occupational diseases are difficult to identify and are not well documented in the Annual Survey. There is also evidence that injuries are underreported. In addition, the survey excludes public sector workers, the self-employed, household workers, and workers on farms with fewer than 11 employees.
