Change in Age Break for Infants

There are currently three prescription age breaks in ISIS for the infant category: 0 – 5 months, 6 months with infant cereal, and 7 – 11 months with cereal and juice.

The prescription age break in ISIS with the new food package is now impacted by the feeding choice of the infant. For fully breastfeeding infants, the prescription age break is 0 – 5 months and 6 – 11 months with the addition of cereal and infant food. For formula fed infants, and infants with some breastfeeding, and infants who are mostly breastfeeding, the prescription age break in ISIS is 0 – 3 months and 4 – 5 months due to the differing amounts of infant formula, and 6 – 11 months with the addition of cereal and infant food.

Infants will no longer receive juice in their infant food package.

Fully Breastfeeding Infants

Prescribing Food Packages for Fully Breastfeeding Infants

Infants who are fully breastfeeding will receive a default package of IB1 (0-5 mo, Fully Breastfed, No Checks) if they are birth through 5 months of age. Infants who are fully breastfeeding will receive a default package of IB2 (6-11 mo, Fully Breastfed, Infant Food+Meat) if they are 6 through 11 months of age. The 12th month of an infant's life will be explained later in this module.

The IB1 and IB2 default package is a result of an infant with the answer B (Breastfeeding) to the question "How are you feeding your baby?" on the Health Information – Infant screen. Similar to current practice, ISIS will be programmed such that all infants with a feeding choice of B will be defaulted to an IB1 or an IB2 food package, depending on the age of the infant.

Food packages for the fully breastfeeding infant are displayed below. For the fully breastfed infant, in either of the age ranges listed below, there are no other food packages viewable by selecting F5 Change Food Package from the prescription screen, since the food packages listed below are the only options. If staff selects F5 Change Food Package for either the IB1 or IB2 package, the error message, "No Other Prescriptions Available" is displayed.

- IB1 0-5 mo, Fully Breastfed, No Checks
- IB2 6-11 mo, Fully Breastfed, Infant Food+Meat

Revision of ISIS Prescription Screen

Implementation of the new food package has resulted in a change or omission to the questions asked on some of the Prescribe Food Package screens. In the case of the fully breastfeeding infant 0-5 months of age, however, there is no change in the Prescribe Food Package screen – there continues to be no questions necessary as shown below.

ISIS Browse Family Issued Food Packages Screen

Another enhancement of the prescription screen that also will become a standard feature throughout ISIS is the replacement of the F1 Help key with an F1 History key. It could be very useful in October 2009 to view what food packages were previously issued in September 2009 before the food package transition. The F1 History key will allow users to do this. When the F1 History key is pressed, ISIS will display the Browse Family Issued Food Packages screen. This screen displays all of the family members' issued food packages during their entire time on WIC. This screen is similar to the one found through the Browse Family Issued Food Packages option on the Food Instruments Menu except that family comments are not viewable. The F1 History key can be helpful at recertification if staff want to see whether the participant was issued a package other than the default in the previous month (e.g., therapeutic package).

Formula Fed Infants

Prescribing Food Packages for Formula Fed Infants

Formula fed infants will receive a default package of IF1 (0-3 mo, Contract Formula) if they are birth through 3 months of age. Formula fed infants will receive a default package of IFQ (4-5 mo, Contract Formula) if they are 4 through 5 months of age. Formula fed infants will receive a default package of IF2 (6-11 mo, Infant Food+Contract Formula) if they are 6 months through 11 months of age. The 12th month of an infant's life will be explained later in this module.

The IF1, IFQ, and IF2 default packages are a result of an infant with the answer F (Formula Feeding) to the question "How are you feeding your baby?" on the Health Information – Infant screen. Similar to current practice, ISIS will be programmed such that all infants with a feeding choice of F will be defaulted to an IF1, IFQ, or an IF2 food package, depending on the age of the infant.

Food packages for formula fed infants are displayed below. For the formula fed infant less than 12 months of age, in any of the age ranges listed below, there are no other food packages viewable by selecting F5 Change Food Package from the prescription screen, since the food packages listed below are the only options. If staff selects F5 Change Food Package for the IF1, IFQ, or IF2 package, the error message, "No Other Prescriptions Available" is displayed. Note there are twelve therapeutic food packages for the formula fed infant depending on the age of the infant (details on the therapeutic packages will be shared separately from this training). As is current ISIS practice, in order to view the therapeutic food packages for the infant, the "Feeding Choice" on the Prescribe Food Package screen needs to be changed from F to T (Therapeutic Formula) followed by the F10 Show Change key to display the age appropriate therapeutic packages.

The default or standard food package is shown in bold below.

- IFQA 4-5 mo, Therap Formula-WIC Agency

- IF2P 6-11 mo, Infant Food+Therap Formula-Other Provider
- IF2G 6-11 mo, Infant Food+Therap Formula-State WIC
- IF2A 6-11 mo, Infant Food+Therap Formula-WIC Agency

- IF3P 6-11, RX NO Infant Food, Incr Therap-Other Provider
- IF3G 6-11, RX NO Infant Food, Incr Therap-State WIC

Combo Breastfeeding Infants

Prescribing Food Packages for Combo Breastfeeding Infants


The Interim Rule continues to identify a distinction in the amount of breastfeeding an infant is receiving when the infant is not fully breastfeeding. Infants who are breastfeeding and also taking some formula can now be thought of as “combo **mostly** breastfeeding” or “combo **some** breastfeeding”. The distinction between these two is defined in the Interim Rule as the amount of formula the infant is being fed and is explained below.

Combo Mostly Breastfeeding Infants

Infants who are combo **mostly** breastfeeding will receive a default package of IC1 (1-3 mo, **Mostly** BF), ICQ (4-5 mo, **Mostly** BF) or IC2 (6-11 mo, **Mostly** BF + Infant Food), depending on the age of the infant. The formula amount must be less than half the formula that a fully formula fed infant receives. For example, in order for a two-month-old combo breastfeeding infant to receive an IC1 package, the infant would need to be taking 4 cans or less of Enfamil LIPIL powdered formula per month. There is a chart displayed in the next section that shows the number of cans for each type and kind of formula that depicts half the formula of a fully formula fed infant.

The IC1, ICQ, and IC2 default packages are a result of an infant with the answer C (Combo Breastfeeding) to the question “How are you feeding your baby?” on the Health Information – Infant screen, which is shown below. After the infant is greater than 30 days old, ISIS will be programmed such that all infants with a feeding choice of C will be defaulted to an IC1, ICQ or an IC2 food package, depending on the age of the infant. A description of the process for the first 30 days of age for the infant will be explained in a later section.

Current ISIS Health Information – Infant Screen



Food packages for the combo **mostly** breastfeeding infant are displayed below and are viewable by selecting F5 Change Package from the prescription screen. For the combo **mostly** breastfeeding infant, in any of the age ranges listed below, the food package for the combo **some** breastfeeding infant is the only other food package available by selecting F5 Change Food Package from the prescription screen (this will be discussed in the next section). Note there are twelve therapeutic food packages for the combo **mostly** breastfed infant depending on the age of the infant (details on the therapeutic packages will be shared separately from this training). As is current ISIS practice, in order to view the therapeutic food packages for the infant, the “Feeding Choice” on the Prescribe Food Package screen needs to be changed from C to Z (Combo Breastfeeding and Therapeutic Formula) followed by the F10 Show Change key to display the age appropriate therapeutic packages.

The default or standard food package is shown in bold below.

Combo Some Breastfeeding Infants

The IO food package series, IO1 (1-3 mo, **Some** BF), IOQ (4-5 mo, **Some** BF) and the IO2 (6-11 mo, **Some** BF + Infant Food), is designed for the combo breastfeeding infant who is doing **some** breastfeeding yet also taking formula. The formula amount the infant is receiving is more than half of the formula that a fully formula fed infant receives. For example, using the same example above, if the two-month-old combo **some** breastfeeding infant is taking 5 or more cans of Enfamil LIPIL powdered formula per month, then the correct food package for this infant is the IO1 package. There is a chart displayed in the next section that shows the number of cans for each type and kind of formula that depicts more than half the formula of a fully formula fed infant.

Food packages for the combo **some** breastfeeding infant are available for selection initially through F5 Change Prescription from the IC1, ICQ or IC2 (**mostly** breastfeeding) prescription screens, and are displayed below. For the combo **some** breastfeeding infant, in any of the age ranges listed below, the food package for the combo **mostly** breastfeeding infant is the only other food package available by selecting F5 Change Food Package from the prescription screen (this will be discussed in the next section).

Note there are twelve therapeutic food packages for the combo **some** breastfed infant depending on the age of the infant (details on the therapeutic packages will be shared separately from this training. As is current ISIS practice, in order to view the therapeutic food packages for the infant, the “Feeding Choice” on the Prescribe Food Package screen needs to be changed from C to Z (Combo breastfeeding and Therapeutic formula) followed by the F10 Show Change key to display the age appropriate therapeutic packages. There is no default package set in ISIS for this food package series since they must each be individually selected.



Please note that for the combo **mostly** breastfeeding infant food packages, if staff enter in a number for the cans or ounces of formula used that exceeds the allowed amount, the following error message will be displayed at the top of the screen, "Amount Invalid for Package. Reassess Needs".

Please note that for the combo **some** breastfeeding infant food packages, if staff enter in a number for the cans or ounces of formula used that is less than the allowed amount, the following error message will be displayed at the top of the screen, "Amount Invalid for Package. Reassess Needs". If staff enters a number for the cans (or ounces) of formula used that is more than the allowed amount, the following error message will be displayed at the top of the screen, "Input is invalid for cans."

Infants Birth through 30 Days of Age

Approach to Prescribing Food Packages for Infants Birth through 30 Days of Age

The Interim Rule specifies an approach for the WIC food package during an infant's first month of life in order to support the breastfeeding experience. California WIC's policy in the first month is to support the breastfeeding woman and her infant by not routinely issuing formula. California WIC recognizes that when a woman chooses to breastfeed her infant, an important feature for successfully establishing breastfeeding is not introducing any formula in the first 30 days.

However, there may be infrequent situations in which there are exceptions, and according to policy, formula is issued during the first 30 days (exception issuance).

If an infant is enrolled in the first 30 days of age, and the feeding choice on the Health Information – Infant screen is B (Breastfeeding), then the default food package is the IB1 (0-5 mo, Fully Breastfed, No Checks), and the full year's certification period for the infant is filled in with the appropriate fully breastfeeding food packages, as described above in the Fully Breastfeeding Infant section of this module.

If an infant is enrolled in the first 30 days of age, and the feeding choice on the Health Information – Infant screen is F (Formula Fed), then the default food package is the IF1 (0-3 mo, Contract Formula), and the full year's certification period for the infant is filled in with the appropriate formula feeding food packages, as described above in the Formula Fed Infant section of this module.

If an infant is enrolled in the first 30 days of age, and the feeding choice on the Health Information – Infant screen is C (Combo Breastfeeding), a new approach is being built to support the breastfeeding experience for the infant and mother. With the feeding choice of C (Combo Breastfeeding), it will be important for staff to assess this early infant feeding experience, to support the mother, and to educate about appropriate infant feeding practices. As staff presses F11 to leave the Health Information – Infant screen with a C for feeding choice, a reminder message will appear at the top of the screen, "Please Complete a Breastfeeding Assessment for this Infant." A complete assessment will be required when the feeding choice is C (Combo Breastfeeding).

When staff reach the Prescribe Food Package screen for this C (Combo Breastfeeding) infant, the default food package is the package for a fully breastfeeding infant, the IB1 (0-5 mo, Fully Breastfed, No Checks) food package, with B (Breastfeeding) displayed as the response to the “Feeding Choice” field. Even though a C (Combo Breastfeeding) was selected on the Health Information - Infant screen, ISIS will be programmed to override this choice when an infant is birth through 30 days of age, and, instead, assume that the infant will become a fully breastfeeding infant after intervention by WIC staff through the infant feeding assessment. A message on the top of the screen will appear when staff first enters the Prescribe Food Package screen stating, “Infant Feeding Choice Has Been Changed to a B. Infant Less Than 30 Days Old.” This message helps alert staff that this infant had an earlier feeding choice of C (Combo Breastfeeding), but since this is the first 30 days of age, WIC’s breastfeeding policy urges no routine issuance of formula.

If it is determined through the breastfeeding assessment, however, that the infant, for some nutritional, health, or other reason aligned with the California WIC policy, is not fully breastfeeding, then staff may change “Feeding Choice” on the Prescribe Food Package screen to a C (Combo Breastfeeding), press F10 Show Change, and now the IC1 (1-3 mo, **Mostly** BF) food package is displayed as the default. The IC1 food package will allow for a small amount of formula to be issued to the infant (less than half of the amount of formula that a fully formula fed infant receives). Staff is encouraged to support the mother and infant’s breastfeeding experience with strategies for the mother to fully breastfeed.

In the situation described above for the combo breastfeeding infant, the F5 Change Food Package screen assessable through the Prescribe Food Package screen, will display both the IC1 (1-3 mo, **Mostly** BF) and the IO1 (1-3 mo, **Some** BF) food package series. As described above, the food package selected for the infant is dependent on the breastfeeding experience and the amount of formula the infant needs. If the combo breastfeeding infant is found to be taking more than half the amount of formula that a fully formula fed infant receives, then staff must change the food package to the appropriate IO1 (1-3 mo, **Some** BF) food package.

Specifics about documenting the outcome to the breastfeeding assessment for this combo breastfeeding infant during the first 30 days are covered separately from this ISIS update.

Regardless of whether an IC1 (1-3 mo, **Mostly** BF) or an IO1 (1-3 mo, **Some** BF) food package has been issued to the infant during the first 30 days of age, only one month’s food package will be able to be printed, and no future food prescriptions will be filled in for the certification period for the infant. It is important for the mother and infant to come back to WIC the following month so staff can provide support and education during this early infant feeding period. The Prescribe Food Package screen for a combo **mostly** breastfeeding infant who enrolled in their first 30 days is shown below.

Infants During 12th Month of Age

Approach to Prescribing Food Packages for Infants During Their 12th Month

Currently, there are rules about the type of package that is prescribed during the infant's 12th month of age. Currently in ISIS the package placed in the infant's prescription plan for the 12th month of the certification is the same as that which is in the 11th month. The same logic will be applied to the new food packages during the 12th month – the package that will be displayed in the 12th month will be the same as the 11th month. If the infant is fully breastfeeding, the 12th month package will be the IB2 package. If the infant is formula feeding, the package in the 12th month will be the same type of formula package that was prescribed for the 11th month.

During the 12th month of an existing infant certification, if the participant's appointment is on or after the first birthday and the mom desires a fresh whole milk package, staff may go through F5 Change Food Package option to select a fresh whole milk food package. However, if the appointment is before the infant's one year birthday, then no fresh whole milk packages are viewable through F5 Change Package option.

Food packages for the infant in the 12th month of certification, available on or after the first birthday, are displayed below.

- IT4W First Birthday, Whole Milk
- IT4L First Birthday, Low Lactose Whole Milk

Association of Infant and Woman Food Packages

The food package ID's that have been created for the infant and women categories were done with the intent that there is a helpful matching association between the infant and woman's food packages for the different feeding situations at the various months of age for the infant. The tables below outline these associations so that staff can see which food packages align with each other.

Case Scenarios

#1. A newly postpartum mom comes to WIC to enroll her one-week-old infant. She was on WIC during her pregnancy and now wants to enroll her new baby. Mom tells the WIC staff member during enrollment that she has been fully breastfeeding without problems and plans to continue, but would like one can of formula just in case she stops producing milk and the baby gets extra hungry. What should the staff member do?

The WIC staff member should enroll the infant and select B (Breastfeeding) as the feeding choice since the mom is fully breastfeeding. During the breastfeeding assessment, the staff member should provide breastfeeding information, encourage the mom to fully breastfeed, and offer peer counseling support. Since there is no nutritional or health condition that would warrant the infant receiving formula in the first 30 days, the staff member should leave the feeding choice as B (Breastfeeding) on the Prescribe Food Package screen. The default food package of IB1 (0-5 mo, Fully Breastfed, No Checks) is displayed and appropriate for the infant. There are no ISIS food questions to answer and prescriptions for the remainder of the certification period will be built after the staff member presses F11.

#2. A mom and her six-month-old infant are here at WIC for a mid-certification appointment. Mom has been breastfeeding her infant 2-3 times a day and using 4 cans of Enfamil AR powdered formula each month since the infant was 2 months old. The infant had been receiving the ICQ (4-5 mo, Mostly BF) package because 4 cans of Enfamil AR is less than half of the formula that a fully formula fed infant receives. The mom now wants to receive 6 cans of Enfamil AR. What should the WIC staff member do?

The WIC staff member should offer breastfeeding support to see if the baby can stay as combo *mostly* breastfeeding and receive only 4 cans of Enfamil AR. If the mom wants to increase to 6 cans of Enfamil AR, the infant would be considered combo *some* breastfeeding because the formula amount the infant would receive would be more than half of the formula that a fully formula fed infant would receive. If the infant is left as combo *mostly* breastfeeding, ISIS will update the prescription plan to issue an IC2 (6-11 mo, Mostly BF + Infant Food) at 6 months of age. The WIC staff member can answer the food questions on the Prescribe Food Package screen.

If the mom chooses to go with 6 cans of Enfamil AR, then the food package must be changed to an IO2 (6-11 mo, Some BF + Infant Food). The WIC staff member can access the IO2 package through the F5 Change Food Package option on the prescription screen. The staff member places an S next to the IO2 package, and presses F11. The staff member will need to ask mom the infant's food package questions on the Prescribe Food Package screen as they have reverted to the defaults when the package was changed. Once the questions are answered and the staff member presses F11, the prescription and infant's food choices will be built for the remainder of the certification period.

#3. A mom comes to enroll her twenty-day-old infant onto the WIC Program. She is currently breastfeeding her newborn most of the day but supplementing with the equivalent of 2 cans of Enfamil powdered formula each month because the infant is having persistent latch and suck problems. What should the WIC staff member do and what food package will the infant receive?

The WIC staff member should proceed with enrolling the baby and enter a C (Combo Breastfeeding) on the Health Information – Infant screen. As staff presses F11 to leave the Health Information – Infant screen with a 'C' for feeding choice, a reminder message will appear at the top of the screen, "Please Complete a Breastfeeding Assessment for this Infant." A complete breastfeeding assessment should be done by the WIC staff member since the infant is within the first 30 days of life and has a C (Combo Breastfeeding) for feeding choice. The staff member should provide breastfeeding support and educate about appropriate infant feeding practices as part of the assessment.

When the staff member reaches the Prescribe Food Package screen, the default food package is the package for a fully breastfeeding infant, IB1 (0-5 mo, Fully Breastfed, No Checks) and a B (Breastfeeding) is displayed as the response to "Feeding Choice". Even though C (Combo Breastfeeding) was selected on the Health Information - Infant screen for "Feeding Choice", ISIS will override this choice when the infant is birth through 30 days of age, and assume that the infant will become a fully breastfeeding infant after the breastfeeding assessment. A reminder message will appear on the screen regarding the ISIS override.

Since the infant is not fully breastfeeding and has a health reason that warrants exception formula issuance, the staff member should document per policy and change the "Feeding Choice" on the Prescribe Food Package screen to a 'C' (Combo Breastfeeding), and press F10 Show Change to display the IC1 (1-3 mo, Mostly BF) food package. The IC1 food package will allow for 2 cans of powdered Enfamil formula to be selected as the response to the question, "How many cans of formula do you use each month?" After the staff member answers the food questions and presses F11, only one month's prescription will be built and issued to ensure that the mom and infant return to WIC the following month so staff can provide support and education on early infant feeding.
