

The California Department of Public Health, Food and Drug Branch, is pleased to present two trainings relevant to the food industry. Each workshop lasts one half day and is tailored to fit the food safety professional's busy schedule. All workshops listed are offered free of charge, although advanced registration is required.



"Good Manufacturing Practices for the Food Industry" is an introduction to the current Good Manufacturing Practices (cGMP) for food facilities covered in 21 CFR Part 110. Sections discussed include Personnel, Plants and Grounds, Sanitation, Process Controls and their relationship to the regulation.

"Food Recalls, Essentials for Action" is focused on what companies should consider immediately before, during and shortly after a recall or food safety event. Additionally, a review of regulatory expectations during recalls will be covered. The course is intended for food industry owners, managers, and persons having responsibility for developing and implementing food recall plans. This course has been adapted and condensed from full day workshops presented in 2008 to accommodate the business needs of participants.
