Handout: Public Reporting Timeline (v. 7/28/10)

Summary:

- To clarify expectations for website appearance, data that is publicly reported and accompanying information will have the same format and structure (with different headers) as the HAI-AC public website.
- The timeline will serve as future agendas. Structure was reviewed.
 - The first priority is to prepare educational materials to accompany 2008-09 employee influenza vaccination/declination rates; next deadlines for 2009-10 flu data and Jan 1 data are listed
 - Goal is for HAI Program website to go live on August 6th.
 - It would be best if lay interpretation of those results be available by the time of public posting
- Influenza Report for 2008-2009 data is in final approval; will be released in 3 sections: Summary, Tables, Technical Report.
 - Need to ensure that Summary is level appropriate for the public; unsure if translation services are available to try to make language appropriate.
 - Subcommittee must develop its own internal approval process.
 - There is an example of public reporting of employee influenza vaccination results (Iowa).
- Moving forward, there was discussion about whether full HAI-AC approvals could be sought for Subcommittee activities via email vote to move projects along. Bagley-Keene has been updated in 2010 and may preclude such activity. An update will be given.
- When discussing formatting limitations of the anticipated HAI Program website, it was noted that a CDPH website for H1N1 has both a breakdown of local jurisdictions by county and different languages. The link is below:
