

## EXAMPLE STATEMENTS OF DETERMINATION

**(a) ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED**

*[See GC Sections 11346.2(b)(3), 11346.5(a)(13) and 11346.9(a)(4) and (5)]*

The Department has determined that no reasonable alternative considered by the Department or that has otherwise been identified and brought to the attention of the Department would be more effective in carrying out the purpose for which this action is proposed, or would be as effective as and less burdensome to affected private persons than the proposed action.

**(b) LOCAL MANDATE DETERMINATION**

*[See GC Sections 11346.5(a)(5) and (6); 11346.9(a)(2); 11347.3(b)(3) and (5) and SAM Section 6601 et seq.]*

The Department has determined that the proposed regulations would not impose a mandate on local agencies or school districts, nor are there any costs for which reimbursement is required by Part 7 (commencing with Section 17500) of Division 4 of the Government Code.

**(c) ECONOMIC IMPACT STATEMENT**

*[See GC Sections 11346.2(b)(4); 11346.3(a), (a)(2) and (b); 11346.5(a)(7), (8), and (10); and 11347.3(b)(4) and (7)] [NOTE: If a determination is made that the regulation "may have" a significant statewide adverse impact see GC Section 11346.5(a)(7) for further requirements.]*

The Department has made an initial determination that the proposed regulations would not have a significant statewide adverse economic impact directly affecting businesses, including the ability of California businesses to compete with businesses in other states. The Department has determined that the proposed regulations would not significantly affect the following:

1. The creation or elimination of jobs within the State of California.
2. The creation of new businesses or the elimination of existing businesses within the State of California.
3. The expansion of businesses currently doing business within the State of California.

**(d) EFFECT ON SMALL BUSINESSES**

*[See GC Sections 11342.610; 11346.2(b)(3)(B) and 11346.9(a)(5); and CCR Title 1 Section 4.]*

The Department has determined that the proposed regulations would affect small businesses.

**OR**

The Department has determined that the proposed regulations would not affect small businesses.

**(e) HOUSING COSTS DETERMINATION**

If the Department is adopting a reporting requirement which is intended to be applicable to businesses then the SOD (Public Notice) must include a finding that the requirement is necessary for the health, safety, or welfare of the people of the state that the regulation apply to businesses.

*This requirement does not typically apply to Department regulations.*
