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Task Force Background

- HiAP Task Force established under Strategic Growth Council by Executive Order S-04-10
- "...to identify priority programs, policies, and strategies to improve the health of Californians while advancing the SGC's goals..."
- 19 Agencies, Depts, and Offices
- Facilitated and staffed by CDPH

Health in All Policies: Process

- Collected 1,200+ recommendations
 - Task Force meetings
 - Meetings with individual members
 - Public workshops
 - Written public comments
 - Key informant interviews
 - Stakeholder advisory group
- Consensus process → 34 recommendations
 - Informal criteria applied
 - Impacted agencies have veto power



Update Since Oct. 29

- Report prepared
- Report accepted by SGC on Dec. 3
- SGC direction
 - Continue Task Force
 - Identify priority recommendations
 - Based on SGC jurisdiction, near-term feasibility, and potential impact
 - Develop implementation plans by July 2011

Recommendations

- Promote Healthy Communities
 - Active Transportation; Housing & Indoor Spaces; Parks, Urban Greening & Places to be Active; Violence Prevention; Healthy Food
- Promote Healthy Public Policy
 - State Guidance; Embedding Health in Decision-Making; Data & Research; Collaboration & Community Engagement; Continue the Task Force

Active Transportation

- Complete Streets
 - Training for road designers, planners, operations
- Safety of all users
 - Allow localities to lower speed limits
 - Discussion on lower highway speed limits
- Data
 - Map transit to essential destinations
 - Health impacts of active transportation



Housing & Indoor Spaces

- Incentives for healthy housing
 - Universal design, gardens, smoke-free
- Smart housing siting
 - Bonus points for infill/TOD
 - Reconcile air quality & siting near roadways
- Smoke-free environments



Parks, Urban Greening, & Places to be Active

- Urban greening
 - Explore specialty crop block grants for gardens/fruit trees
- Joint use of facilities
- Tobacco waste



Violence Prevention

- Analyze violence prevention spending
- Crime and Violence Prevention Center

Healthy Food

- Farm to fork
 - Barriers to access of locally grown foods
 - Contracting barriers, safe use of school-grown food
- State food assistance programs
 - Policies to increase participation in CalFresh
 - Limit use of food stamps – no SLB purchase
- California Food Policy Council
- Leverage State spending
 - Healthy food procurement policy



Promote Healthy Public Policy: State Guidance

- Health perspective in State guidance
 - OPR General Plan guidance
 - Caltrans RTP guidelines



Embedding Health in Decision-Making

- Health and equity criteria in grants
- Explore integration of health analysis
 - Feasibility study re: analysis of legislation/BCPs
 - Explore appropriate integration of HIA

Data & Research

- Health & health equity indicators
 - Healthy community indicators
- Evidence-based practices
 - Bonus points for evidence-based practices

Cross-Agency Collaboration & Expertise

- Deeper understanding & collaboration across State agencies
 - Share trainings
 - Identify/reconcile competing public policy goals
- Improve substantive community engagement
 - Training, incentives, coordinated outreach
