**AUGUST 2010 DRAFT SAFE DRINKING WATER STATE REVOLVING FUND (SDWSRF) PROJECT
PRIORITY LIST (PPL). COMMENTS DUE BY SEPTEMBER 7, 2010**

The August 2010 Draft SDWSRF PPL is now available for public review and comment. The draft PPL is a ranking of all public water system projects that have applied to be considered for SDWSRF funding. Only those projects listed on the PPL are eligible for funding consideration. In February 2009, CDPH advised all public water systems of the opportunity to submit projects for consideration of the American Reinvestment and Recovery Act (ARRA) funding. Pre-applications submitted for ARRA that were not selected for funding have been merged into the 2010 draft PPL. In addition, approximately 400 pre-applications for new or revised projects were received by CDPH during the July 2009 open pre-application period. Projects listed on the previous PPL remain on the draft 2010 PPL unless funded. When finalized, the August 2010 SDWSRF PPL will be used to identify projects to be invited for funding, and will continue in use until superseded.
