POSITION DESCRIPTION: Under general supervision of a scientist or chemist, incumbents perform repetitive chemical or biochemical analyses of water, food, air samples and other materials; care for laboratory equipment and materials; and do other related work. Incumbents make routine qualitative and quantitative biochemical, radiological and chemical analyses of water, food, air samples, sewage and other materials by standardized methods; refer unusual problems or non-standardized results to his/her supervisor for evaluation; make simple arithmetical computations; prepare reagents and solutions; filter and weigh samples preparatory to analysis by a chemist; assist in operation and maintenance of instruments; clean and assemble laboratory apparatus and glassware; and assist in training of subordinate laboratory personnel.

Positions may exist with the Department of Public Health in Alameda County and Contra Costa County.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMITTANCE TO THE EXAMINATION: It is your responsibility to make sure you meet the education and/or experience requirements stated on this announcement on the date you submit your application. Your signature on your application indicates that you have read, understood, and possess the basic qualifications required.

NOTE: Applications/resumes **must** include “to” and “from” dates (month/day/year), time base, civil service class title(s), and range (if applicable) for all work experience. College course information **must** include title, semester or quarter units, name of institution, completion dates, and degree (if applicable). **Applications/resumes received without this information will be rejected. Applicants must submit a copy of unofficial transcripts along with the application when using education to meet the entrance requirements for this examination.**

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

EITHER I

Education: Equivalent to two years of college including completion of college-level introductory laboratory courses in general chemistry, organic chemistry and chemical analysis.

OR II

One year of experience in the California state service performing the duties of a Senior Laboratory Assistant.

AND

Education: Equivalent to completion of the twelfth grade, and completion of college-level introductory laboratory courses in qualitative and quantitative chemical analysis.

OR III

Two years in the California state service performing the duties of a Laboratory Assistant, Range B.

AND

Education: Equivalent to completion of the twelfth grade, and completion of college-level introductory laboratory courses in qualitative and quantitative analysis.

GENERAL QUALIFICATIONS: Candidates must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment, ability to work cooperatively with others, and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required.

EXAMINATION INFORMATION: The entire examination will consist entirely of training and experience evaluation weighted 100%. The Training & Experience Questionnaire (T&E) is designed to elicit a range of specific information about each candidate’s knowledge, abilities, and potential to perform the duties of a Public Health Laboratory Technician I (Chemical Analysis). **The T&E questionnaire will be sent via email to applicants who meet the minimum qualifications. Please monitor your email account’s SPAM, Junk, Bulk, etc. Folder (s) as the examination email may be filtered depending on your specific account settings.**

The Department of Public Health reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service law and rules and all competitors will be notified.

SCOPE: In addition to evaluating the candidate’s relative abilities as demonstrated by quality and breadth of experience, emphasis will be placed on measuring, relative to job demands, each competitor’s:

Knowledge of:

1. College level science, including “hands-on” laboratory courses.
2. Principles of quality control in a laboratory setting.
3. General knowledge of laboratory techniques, materials, and equipment including those used in chemical and biochemical analysis of water, food, air, and sewage.

Ability to:

1. Under supervision, follow directions to successfully complete a variety of tasks in a laboratory.
2. Read and write English at college level to communicate effectively in verbal and written form.
3. Accurately enter data into a database on a computer.
4. Comply with health and safety standards in a laboratory setting.
5. Work efficiently, effectively, and cooperatively in a group.
6. Maintain a neat and orderly workspace.

Skill to:

1. Perform repetitive work using high quality hand-eye coordination to accomplish the tasks of the job.
2. Use computer programs such as MS Word, Access, and/or Excel.
3. Prepare laboratory reagents and solutions and assemble laboratory apparatus for chemical and biochemical analysis.
4. Perform titration for analyses by a chemist or scientist.

ELIGIBLE LIST INFORMATION: Possession of the entrance requirement does not assure a place on the eligible list. In order to obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum rating of 70% must be attained. Names of successful competitors are merged into the open eligible list established for use by the Department of Public Health in order of final scores regardless of testing date. Eligibility expires **24** months after it is established unless the needs of the service and conditions of the list warrant a change in this period.

Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) sub-divisional promotional, 2) departmental promotional, 3) multi-departmental promotional, 4) service-wide promotional, 5) departmental open, and 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first

VETERANS PREFERENCE: Veterans preference will be granted in this examination since it does qualify as an entrance examination. California law limits granting of veterans preference to entrance examinations. Directions for applying for veterans' preference credits are provided on the Veterans Preference Application form, which is available from the State Personnel Board or the department shown on this announcement.

Effective January 1, 2014, Veterans' Preference will be awarded to qualifying Veterans who are successful in the examination in the form of Rank placement rather than points. All individuals awarded Veterans' Preference will be certified in the top rank of the eligibility list, regardless of score.

All Open Exams/Eligible lists will award Veterans' Preference, regardless of the classification.
