**4.** 3 children under 6 years old or 60 pounds in the back seat. IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE LAW!



**DID YOU KNOW...**

On January 1, 2005, children **MUST** be secured in the back seat of a vehicle until they are either 6 years old or 60 pounds. Exceptions:

- A. There is no rear seat.
- B. The rear seats are side-facing jump seats.
- C. The rear seats are rear-facing seats.
- D. The child passenger restraint system cannot be installed properly in the rear seat.
- E. All rear seats are already occupied by children under the age of 12 years.
- F. Medical reasons require that the child or ward not ride in the rear seat. The court may require satisfactory proof of the child's medical condition.

Additionally, Vehicle Code Section 27360 (a) states that a child may not ride in the front seat of a motor vehicle with an active passenger air bag if the child is: under one year of age, weighs less than 20 pounds, or riding rear-facing in a child passenger restraint system.
