
Asthma Inequities in Black Californians

What are health inequities?

Health inequities are differences in health conditions and death rates across groups of people that are widespread, avoidable, unfair, and unjust.

1 in 5 Black Californians have asthma



Black Californians are more likely to suffer from severe asthma and die from asthma compared to White Californians:







2 times more

deaths from asthma

Severe asthma:

- Requires high-dose medication.
- Causes higher rates of emergency room visits, hospital stay, and death.
- Remains uncontrolled despite medication.
- Impacts daily activities, work or school, and quality of life.

What causes health inequities in asthma?



Racism, classism, and discrimination in policies that disadvantage certain groups of people



Pollution in the environment that makes asthma symptoms worse
