

**Radon Exposure Potential in Regions of California
Served by Tribal Health Programs
July 10, 2025**



The California Department of Public Health (CDPH), Environmental Health Investigations Branch (EHIB) completed an evaluation to identify elevated radon levels in counties across California. Our findings suggest potential exposure to harmful levels of radon gas in some California tribal communities.

Radon is a radioactive gas that can pose serious health risks when it enters a home or building. It is the second leading cause of lung cancer after smoking. Radon is a naturally occurring gas that can move up through the ground, enter homes and other buildings, and mix with the air we breathe. Radon cannot be seen or smelled. The U.S. Surgeon General and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (US EPA) has recommend testing indoor air for radon to determine if radon gas is present and poses a health risk. People can take steps to reduce radon gas levels inside a home or building and thus reduce the risk of harmful exposures.

EHIB has obtained do-it-yourself radon test kits ([Air Chek](#) brand) for the California Rural Indian Health Board (CRIHB) to distribute to tribes at no cost. These are short-term, non-toxic, third-party, charcoal-based absorbent tests with pre-paid mailing to the lab. Results are reported directly to the user (not to EHIB). As requested by CRIHB, EHIB will provide support in outreach, education, and interpretation of testing results.

Radon and Health

Radon is a naturally occurring gas formed by decaying uranium found in the soil. It can adversely impact communities that have higher concentrations of uranium-containing rocks/minerals or tectonic activity, such as some of California's tribal communities, especially certain rural tribal communities.

However, homes and other buildings in locations identified as "lower potential" for radon activity may still have radon gas present that poses a health risk. For this reason, it is important to test the indoor air of all homes and buildings for radon. California's very low radon test rate (0.7 tests per 1,000 housing units) indicates that California residents are less likely to have had their home tested for radon compared to other states. California's low radon test rate creates a large gap in understanding the radon risk across the state and underscores the importance of indoor air

testing ([ALA, 2022](#); [CDPH, accessed 5-30-25](#)).

People can be exposed unknowingly to radon in their homes for years. Radon gas enters homes and other buildings through cracks and holes in the foundation, or gaps in sewer and water lines. A building can trap radon inside, where it could accumulate in the indoor air. When we breathe in radon gas, the radioactive particles in the gas can get trapped in our lungs, damage lung tissue, and after many years could lead to lung cancer. According to the US EPA, a high radon level is 4 picocuries per liter (pCi/L) of radon in the indoor air. US EPA denotes this level as the “action level” for radon. If a home or building tests at or above this level (4 pCi/L), it is important to take steps to reduce the amount of radon in the indoor air.

While not everyone exposed to elevated levels of radon will develop lung cancer, radon-induced lung cancer ranks among the top 10 causes of all cancer deaths in the United States among adults who have never smoked ([US EPA, accessed 5-30-25](#)). According to US EPA, if a smoker is exposed to high radon levels, their risk of lung cancer is even greater. US EPA estimates that if 1,000 non-smokers were exposed to 4 pCi/L of radon (US EPA’s radon action level) over their lifetime, about 7 could get lung cancer. If 1,000 smokers were exposed to the same level of radon, about 62 could get lung cancer. The risk of developing cancer greatly increases with higher levels of radon (refer to Table 1).

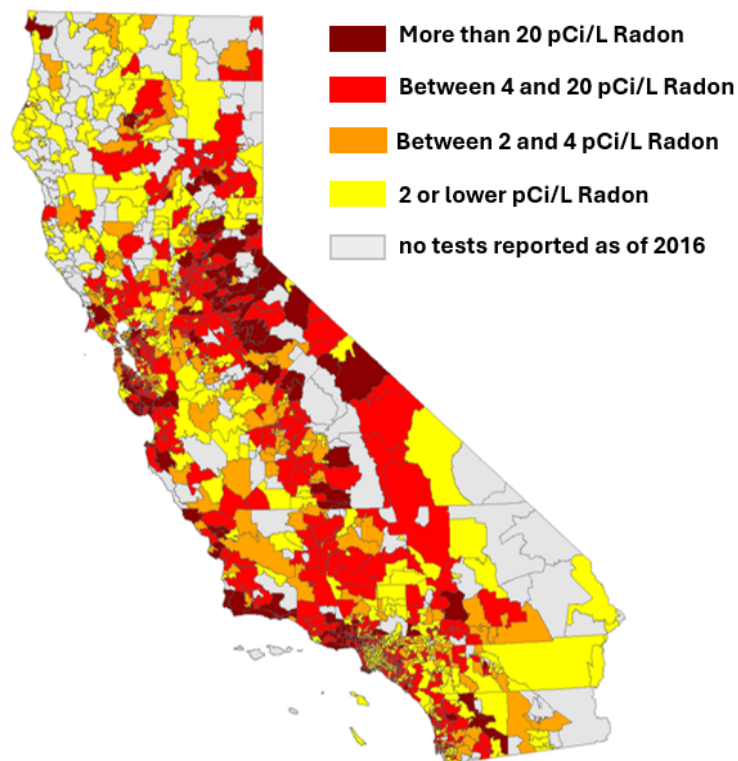

Radon Levels Reported in Indoor Air in California

Some amount of radon in indoor air has been found in every California county. The [California Geological Survey \(CGS\)](#) of the California Department of Conservation worked with [CDPH](#) to study and map the geologic potential for elevated indoor radon in specific regions of the state ([CGS, accessed 5-30-25](#)).

EHIB leveraged an existing database of indoor radon test results reported to CDPH through early 2016 (CDPH, accessed 6-27-25) and mapped the maximum levels found in each zip code as shown in Figure 1 (data used for Figure 1 can be found in this [table of maximum reported indoor radon levels by zip code](#)). Even given the overall relatively limited testing coverage, this analysis revealed that many areas not previously identified as having high radon potential did, in fact, have buildings with high indoor radon levels.

Potential for Elevated Radon Exposure in Regions Served by Tribal Health Programs

EHIB found that there are tribal organizations throughout the state in areas where harmful indoor levels of radon were found (exceeding the US EPA action level of 4 pCi/L). Homes and buildings located in these communities have a greater potential to contain elevated radon and should have the indoor air tested.

The twelve California rural tribal health programs listed below are members of CRIHB that operate at least one office or clinic in one or more zip codes in which a maximum level of radon reported in indoor air exceeded the US EPA action level of 4 pCi/L. Six programs, as indicated with an asterisk (*), operate in areas with a maximum reported radon level at least 2.5x greater (and thus a much greater potential health risk) than the US EPA action level (up to 136.9 pCi/L). See **Appendix A** for a table of maximum radon levels among the zip codes in which a CRIHB member clinic, office, and other facility is located.

Additional rural tribal communities as well as some urban tribal communities may also be exposed to elevated radon. At the request of CRIHB, EHIB evaluated additional tribal health program addresses, including addresses provided by CRIHB and addresses affiliated with the California Consortium for Urban Indian Health (CCUIH). **Appendix B** presents a combined table of maximum radon levels by county and zip code (or proxy for tribal lands) for all tribal health programs and organizations for which EHIB had an address at the time of this report. Among the additional addresses evaluated by EHIB, seven CCUIH programs, listed below, operate at least one office or clinic in one or more zip codes in which a maximum level of radon reported in indoor air exceeded the US EPA action level of 4pCi/L. Four programs, as indicated with an asterisk (*), operate in areas with a maximum reported radon level at least 2.5x greater (and thus a much greater potential health risk) than the US EPA action level (up to 39.6 pCi/L).

In summary, based on our evaluation of available indoor air radon data, some tribal populations are likely to have exposure to elevated indoor radon. The only way to know for sure is to test the indoor air. Testing can be done by professionals or a do-it-yourself home test kit, such as the do-it-yourself test kits ([Air Chek](#) brand) that EHIB has obtained for CRIHB to distribute to tribes.

Opportunities to Address Radon

EHIB recognizes that raising awareness within communities on public health issues is most effective when conducted in collaboration with partners. As a trusted partner with tribes,

CRIHB is uniquely positioned to assist in providing radon awareness and testing to tribal members. As mentioned earlier, EHIB has obtained do-it-yourself radon test kits ([Air Chek](#) brand) for CRIHB to distribute to tribes. EHIB is also available to assist with messaging and materials development as desired.

It is possible to reduce the risk of lung cancer by lowering radon gas levels in a home or building. This is true even if someone has already lived with radon exposure for a long time. There are effective strategies to reduce radon indoors, as described in guidance produced by the US EPA ([US EPA, 2025](#)) and the CDC ([CDC, accessed 5-30-25](#)).

Professional radon mitigation is always recommended for homes and buildings in which radon levels are above 4 pCi/L. When resources are not readily available, individuals can pursue interim low-cost or no-cost strategies to lower radon levels in a home or building. For example, individuals can reduce radon levels indoors by regularly opening windows to bring outdoor air inside and using fans and vents to circulate the air. This use of natural ventilation helps to dilute the radon concentration indoors. Additionally, sealing cracks in floors and walls can also reduce the amount of radon that enters a home or building.
