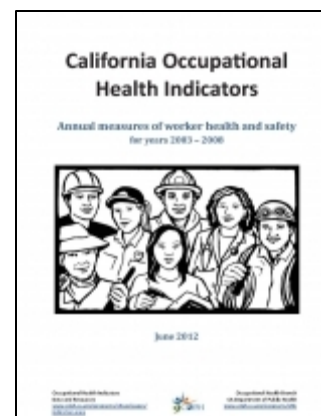
## California Workers' Health

A day laborer falls off an unsafe scaffold and dies. A custodian gets work-related asthma from cleaning products. A painter is tested and found to have lead poisoning.

Every year, work-related injuries and illnesses like these result in substantial human and economic costs. They can be prevented, but having the information necessary to understand the problem is the first step.

[California Occupational Health Indicators](#) are a set of statistics that help explain the current state of worker health.

The [Occupational Health Branch \(OHB\)](#) tracks [California employment demographics](#) and [20 Health Indicators](#) to understand and share trends related to worker injuries, illnesses, exposure and other factors that influence occupational health. Health indicators can tell us where we may need to invest prevention resources.
