2025 Policy Actions of Interest

• In July, CCLHO submitted comments to CDPH on DPH-21-009, New Local Health Department Application, requesting changes to proposed regulations related to health officer qualifications, health officer time basis, requirements for temporary funding, fragmentation of public health service delivery, and communication and coordination between county and city
