Dedication Ceremony for the Thomas Martin McMorrow Training Room, Contra Costa County Environmental Health Department, Concord, CA

Mr. Thomas McMorrow (November 24, 1912 – October 12, 1992) had the great distinction of practicing environmental health for Contra Costa County and held the very first Registered Environmental Health Specialist Certificate #0001. Director Marilyn Underwood held a dedication ceremony in June 2019 to honor Mr. McMorrow's legacy. Several members of his family attended and fondly shared some of their memories with the audience. Many thanks to Dr. Underwood for collecting and memorializing the life of a pioneer in the field of environmental health.

New Fees for the REHS Application, Initial Registration and Biennial Renewal

In recent years, the REHS program fund expenditures have consistently exceeded program revenues. The program has drawn down the REHS fund such that we can no longer meet program costs. As a result, the REHS Program will raise the fees associated with registrations (renewals and initial), new applications, and exams. As provided for in the 2019-2020 Budget Act, these fees will be increased by 14.6% effective September 1, 2019. The registration renewal fees for retirees will not increase and will remain at \$25. The associated late fee for retirees (\$13) will remain unchanged. The new fee schedule (shown as Table 1 below) is posted on our website at:

^{*} Penalty fees are equal to one half of the renewal registration fee rounded up to the nearest whole dollar amount. Penalties apply to registration fees in arrears over 31 days. As all registrations expire on December 31st, penalties accrue on payments received with a postmark February 1 or later of the following year.
