Adolescent Sexual Health Education Program

July 1, 2022 - June 30, 2023

Purpose

This Survey Results Dashboard includes data from the California Personal Responsibility Education Program (CA PREP) component of the Adolescent Sexual Health Education Program (ASH Ed). Participants completed entry and exit surveys between July 2022-June 2023. The dashboard presents information on participants' background characteristics, sexual experiences, awareness and use of sexual and reproductive health (SRH) services, SRH knowledge, and perceptions and experiences related to CA PREP. These data help identify program successes and provide opportunities for quality improvement.

Figure 1. Percentage of participants by gender identity (n = 8,938)




Figure 3. Percentage of participants by age, in years (n = 9,632)




Figure 2. Percentage of participants by sexual orientation (n = 8,268)




Figure 4. Percentage of participants by housing status (n = 9,427)





Figure 5. Percentage of participants by race and ethnicity (n = 9,445)

Figure 6. Percentage of participants who ever had sexual intercourse (n = 9,110)




Figure 7. Among those who ever had sex, percentage of participants who used a contraceptive method at last sex (n = 1,953)




Figure 8. Among those who ever had sex, percentage of participants who ever received SRH services (n = 1,808)





Figure 9. Participant perceptions of the program (n = 8,632)

Figure 11. Change in percentage of participants who reported they had heard of SRH services in their community at entry and exit (n = 5,802)





Figure 12. Percentage of participants who answered the knowledge questions correctly at entry and exit (n = 5,802)



Dashboard notes

- **Figure 1** 797 participants were missing data for this question. Due to rounding, the percentages may not add up to 100% in pie charts.
- Figure 2 1,467 participants were missing data for this question. Due to rounding, the percentages may not add up to 100% in pie charts.
- Figure 3 103 participants were missing data for this question. Due to rounding, the percentages may not add up to 100% in pie charts.
- **Figure 4** 308 participants were missing data for this question. Due to rounding, the percentages may not add up to 100% in pie charts.
- Figure 5 290 participants were missing data for this question. Due to rounding, the percentages may not add up to 100% in the bar chart.
- **Figure 6** 625 participants were missing data for this question. The All category includes females, males, those who reported other genders, and those who did not report their gender.
- Figure 7 696 participants were missing data for these questions. This figure excludes those who have not had vaginal sex (n = 7,086).
- Figure 8 841 participants were missing data for these questions. The sum of percentages for each service may not equal the number who reported receiving any services, because participants could check multiple services received. Among 7,086 participants who never had vaginal and/or anal sex, 7% accessed any SRH services.
- Figure 9 Number of participants missing data for these questions ranged from 631 to 835.
- Figure 10 This figure excludes those who did not respond to the question (n = 3,028) and those who plan to abstain from sex in the next six months (n = 2,032). The All category includes females, males, other genders, and those who did not report their gender.
- Figure 11 Number of participants missing data for this question: 270 at entry; 551 at exit. An asterisk (*) indicates that difference between entry and exit surveys is statistically significant at p < 0.05.
- Figure 12 Number of participants missing data for these questions: 266 to 401 at entry; 172 to 300 at exit. An asterisk (*) indicates that difference between entry and exit surveys is statistically significant at p < 0.05.

General notes

Entry and exit data were reported by CA PREP participants. The data reflect both online and paper survey administration.
