- 1 Before touching a patient
- 2 Before clean/aseptic procedures
- 3 After body fluid exposure risk
- 4 After touching a resident
- 5 After touching resident surroundings

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## Enhanced Barrier Precautions









#### Clean hands & don gloves/gown during:

- 1 Morning and evening care
- 2 Toileting & changing incontinence briefs
- 3 Device care or use
- 4 Wound care
- Transferring & preparing to leave resident's room







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## Environmental Cleaning for CNAs

CNA & EVS staff can work together to ensure rooms, surfaces, and devices are cleaned and disinfected.

**Cleaning:** the physical removal of all visible and invisible soil (e.g., dust, soil, blood, germs, etc.)

**Disinfection:** the chemical process of killing germs on surfaces

#### **CNAs Can Make an Impact By:**

- Helping clean and disinfect hightouch surfaces (e.g., call lights, doorknobs, light switches, etc.)
- Helping clean spills, etc. when EVS staff are not available.
- Reading labels and knowing contact/wet times for disinfectants at your facility



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### Reusable Medical Device Reprocessing

Some devices, like wheelchairs, walkers, thermometers, and blood pressure cuffs may be used for multiple residents.



Perform hand hygiene before and after using devices



Keep dirty and clean medical devices separate to avoid cross-contamination



Clean and disinfect reusable items between each resident













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
