Recommendations for Cleaning Carts

- Have access to alcohol-based hand rub (ABHR)
- Stock enough microfiber cloths to clean room; change when soiled
- Separate clean and soiled items
- Use buckets or bins for disinfectant solution
- Clean and disinfect reusable equipment
- Know the required contact/wet times for all disinfectants used

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Practices to Avoid with cleaning carts

- Never mix chemicals, refill containers, or use spray bottles
- Do not mix clean and soiled materials
- X Do not use the same cloth for two different resident bedspaces
- Do not use a dirty cloth on a clean area
- Never store personal items, food, or beverages on a cart or in the EVS closet
- X Never leave your cart unattended

- When entering a resident room and before putting on gloves
- Upon leaving a resident room and after removing gloves
- Before touching clean items on a cleaning cart
- 4 Between cleaning resident rooms and bedspaces
- 5 Between dirty & clean tasks
