Request Description

On June 19, 2023, Loma Linda University Children's Hospital ("LLUCH") was granted program flexibility (Flex-4499) for Section 70805 of Title 22, California Code of Regulations pertaining to use of licensed ICU beds in Unit 4700 for non-ICU patients. A copy of the approval letter is attached for reference. LLUCH is requesting renewal for a duration of six months of the program flexibility for Section 70805 that was approved by the Centralized Program Flex Unit.

JUSTIFICATION

Describe why program flexibility is needed.

In order to meet the bed availability and patient placement challenges presented by the influx of non-ICU patients. LLUCH is requesting to use licensed ICU beds for non-ICU patients requiring admission.

ALTERNATIVE CONCEPT

Describe the proposed alternate method for meeting the intent of the regulation. LLUCH is currently licensed for 116 Intensive Care Beds. LLUCH is requesting program flexibility to use 20 of its Pediatric Intensive Care beds located in Unit 4700 (specifically, rooms 6-25) for non-ICU patients. The bed capacity for Unit 4700 is 25 Each of rooms 1 25 has a capacity of 1 patient

- · Rooms 1-5 will continue to be used as licensed ICU beds.
- · Rooms 6-25 will be used for non-ICU patients.

Patient population: There is an average of 8 patient holds on hospital beds awaiting in-patient beds upstairs.

The exclusion criteria would be to not place ICU level of care patients in rooms 4706-4725. The inclusion criteria would be to only place non-ICU patients in rooms 4706-4725.

Title of the nursing personnel with leadership and oversight of the unit is identified in the 4700 Plan for Providing Care, enclosed.

Summary of the pediatric service line: 116 intensive care beds (locations/units and number beds) and pediatric beds (locations/units and number beds)

- 4700 Pediatric Step-Down ICU, located on the 4th floor of the Children's Hospital West building.
- 25 single occupancy beds
- 4800 Pediatric Hematology, Oncology, Blood and Marrow Transplant, located on the 4th floor of the Children's Hospital West building
- 33 single and double occupancy beds
- 5700 Pediatric Intensive Care Unit, located on the 5th floor of the Children's Hospital West building.
- 25 single occupancy beds
- 5800 Pediatric Cardiothoracic Intensive Care Unit, located on the 5th floor of the Children's Hospital West building.
- 33 single and double occupancy beds

The staffing ratio will be 1:4 or less for the non-ICU patients. Any patients who are ICU are 1:2 or less. It will be for general pediatrics.

The nurses that provide care on Unit 4700 all have the following education/orientation to care for patients on the unit.

· General Hospital orientation

General Pediatric Orientation

· Pediatric Critical Care Essentials course that addresses core ICU content, including care of the critically ill patient with respiratory failure (including ventilation), cardiac disease, diabetes ketoacidosis, alteration in labs and blood gases, and other core critical care education.

Advanced Critical Care Core classes which address advanced practice of the above disease types
