

CaREDIE Electronic Case Reporting (eCR) Informational Bulletin

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Purpose: This monthly bulletin will inform stakeholders about Electronic Case Reporting (eCR) with the goal of promoting discussion among clinical care and public health communities on this advancement in public health case reporting. Electronic Case Reporting (eCR) will automate public health case reporting for providers by automatically generating and transmitting case reports directly from the provider's Electronic Health Record (EHR) system to local and state public health authorities. eCR will fulfill the physician communicable disease reporting requirements under state law.




CaREDIE System

How does it work?

The core CaREDIE application is a shared, centralized database that allows public health staff to securely collect data, investigate cases of public health importance, and manage outbreaks. The system allows for the secure sharing of data between state and local staff, and between local health partners, on an as-needed basis. **All notifiable communicable diseases and outbreaks in California can be reported by health care providers and laboratories through the CaREDIE system.**

Integrated Modules in CaREDIE

The Provider Portal and Electronic Lab Reporting modules are currently used for reporting to the CaREDIE system. **A new eCR module is under development for implementation into CaREDIE.**
