


Chronic Hepatitis C History Searches: Step-by-Step

Check the DDP for any chronic hepatitis C history in your jurisdiction:

1. Log into the [CalREDIE Data Distribution Portal](https://calredie.cdph.ca.gov/CalREDIE_Export/login.aspx) (https://calredie.cdph.ca.gov/CalREDIE_Export/login.aspx)
2. Click on the icon to the left of **Reports** (Figure 1)



3. Click the **Begin** button to the right of **Hepatitis C Registry Report** (Figure 2)

- Enter your search criteria (using one or more fields), check each of the resulting person records you would like to see a report for, then click on the **View Report** button (Figure 3).

Request a history search from another CalREDIE jurisdiction:

If you suspect your patient may have history in another California jurisdiction, you can email (or call) them requesting any history they may have. With the exception of San Diego, Los Angeles, and San Francisco, all jurisdictions will be able to run a search as you did in the DDP.
