Checklist of Key Tasks and Contacts for Fair Management

Section A: Animal Exhibit / Venue Inspections Prior to Fair Opening

Entrance

Exhibit Layout
☐ One-way entrance
☐ Stroller and bag storage area
Safety Messaging (circle languages)
Signs placed at or nearby entrance:
☐ Animals can carry germs that can make people sick.
 Language(s): English / Spanish / Other
☐ Young children (under 5 years old), adults 65+, pregnant women, and people with weakened immune systems are more likely to get sick from animal germs.
Language(s): English / Spanish / Other
☐ Do not enter if you or someone you are with is feeling sick with cough, sneezing, or fever.

 No food, drinks, toys, pacifiers, cups, baby bottles, or strollers in animal areas Language(s): English / Spanish / Other
☐ No hand-to-mouth activities in animal areas (e.g., no drinking, eating, bottles, pacifiers, smoking, chewing gum)

☐ Children under 5 years old should be monitored at all times to prevent hand-to-mouth activity while in animal areas.

	Automated waterers functioning properly
	Hoses or other water dispensers in public places labeled "Not for human consumption"
	Floor drains clear of debris and standing water
	Straw / shavings / other material from animal pens not present in public walkways
	Animal pens in good repair; all gates secure
	Fair veterinarian evaluation verifies all animals well and healthy
	All animals (mammals) that have direct interaction with people are vaccinated against rabies
	□ Verified documentation of appropriate rabies vaccination for all animals
	Animal enclosures free of accumulated manure
	Receptacles for manure, bedding, uneaten food, and other organic wastes from animal enclosures outside exhibit area

	Animal feed dispensed in containers that will not be confused as human food (e.g., no ice cream cones)

☐ Food vendors and eating areas (e.g., picnic benches) NOT in exit area
☐ Handwashing stations – total number:
☐ Running water, liquid soap, and paper towel dispensers
☐ Trash receptables located nearby
☐ Accessible to all visitors (including children, adults, and people with disabilities); accommodate different heights, sizes, and assistance devices
Safety Messaging (circle languages)
Signs placed at exit:
☐ Wash hands with soap and water after visiting animal areas (even if you didn't touch any animals).
Language(s): English / Spanish / Other
☐ Wash hands with soap and water before you eat, drink, or put anything in your mouth.
Language(s): English / Spanish / Other
 Help children thoroughly wash their hands with soap and water. Language(s): English / Spanish / Other
