



## School-Located Vaccine Event (SLVE) Incentive Resources

Donated or purchased incentives or wrap-around services can be wonderful ways to increase participation and inspire a fun, cheerful environment at events. A list of ideas and possibilities to consider is below. Be sure to pay attention to equitable distribution of incentives when conducting events at schools when parents/guardians are not present. Students who aren't registered for the SLVE should never be made to feel bad for not getting an incentive if their families did not register them to be vaccinated or they decline their vaccination.

- 1. Food trucks approach local businesses for partnering opportunities.
- 2. Provide loaner iPads for students to use during the event with vaccination knowledge/games.
- Vaccine themed coloring books/pages or story books printed from or purchased online. The following are suggestions for browser searches: vaccine coloring sheets for kids, vaccine coloring books, CDC coloring books, flu coloring pages.

- 4. Partner with local businesses to secure donated gift cards to give away in drawings (local markets, restaurants, movie passes, summer camps, trampoline and adventure parks, pottery/painting shops).





- 5. Offer free t-shirts, hats, notebooks, etc. with school branding to give away in drawings.
- 6. Offer chance to win free tickets to community and school events (football, volleyball, baseball games, school performances).
- 7. Explore sponsorship opportunities with Parent Teacher Organizations to secure a face painter, balloon artist or other kid friendly, age-appropriate entertainer.
- 8. Contact your local therapy dog associations to inquire about having dogs at your event.
- 9. Host a post SLVE party celebrating the health and stellar vaccination rates in your school/community. Ideas include a slip-n-slide, water balloon battle, arts and crafts party, movie, and popcorn outdoor party (sidewalk chalk, bubbles, hula hoops, frisbees, corn-hole), tie-dye party (kids bring own white shirts), pajama party (could be the day of the SLVE), school spirit day (health related theme), pizza or karaoke party.
- 10. Contact your local fire department to ask if they are willing to participate by bringing a ladder truck, distributing fire hats, teaching kids about fire safety like "stop, drop, and roll", and talking to the kids about their jobs.
