
Syphilis is on the rise among California's babies.

Syphilis is an infection spread by sexual contact. Congenital syphilis is when syphilis is passed on from birthing parent to baby during pregnancy or during delivery. It can be life-threatening to the baby.

The number of babies born with **congenital** syphilis increased for the **9**th year in a row.
