

How Do I Enroll into PrEP-AP?

Step 1: Visit an authorized Enrollment Site

Step 2: Enroll into the Gilead Patient Assistance Program (if eligible) and PrEP-AP

Your enrollment worker will assist you with enrolling. You will also be referred to a provider in your health plan network for a PrEP clinical assessment.

Step 3: Visit your provider for an assessment

Your provider will sign your Gilead Patient Assistance Program application, if applicable, and provide you with a copy of your HIV negative lab results.

Step 4: Return your documents to the enrollment site

The enrollment worker will finalize your enrollment into the Gilead Patient Assistance Program (if applicable) and PrEP-AP.

Step 5: Fill your Truvada® prescription

If you were enrolled in the Gilead Patient Assistance Program, you must wait until you receive confirmation of enrollment from Gilead (approximately 2-5 days) before you can get Truvada® free of charge.

Other Important Information

Annual Re-enrollment

All clients are required to re-enroll into PrEP-AP every 12 months. Medicare clients without prescription drug coverage must also re-enroll annually into the Gilead patient Assistance program.

Medical Out of Pocket Costs



Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis Assistance Program (PrEP-AP)



An Informative Guide for
Clients with Medicare

What is PrEP?

PrEP is a once daily medication that individuals can take who are **HIV Negative** to reduce their chance of contracting HIV. A daily dose of PrEP reduces the risk of contracting HIV from sex by more than 90%. Among people who inject drugs, it reduces the risk by more than 70%.

Please Note: PrEP does not protect against pregnancy or Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs).



What Medications are used in PrEP?

Currently Truvada® is the only medication that is approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration for PrEP. Truvada® combines two medications in one: Emtriva (also called emtricitabine or FTC) and Viread (also called tenofovir disoproxil fumarate or TDF).

Who Should Take Truvada®?

Truvada® for PrEP is recommended for any individuals who are at significant risk of contracting HIV including:

- Men who have sex with men (MSM), or who have multiple sex partners;
- Heterosexual and transgender men or women who have multiple sex partners and do not regularly use condoms; and
- Individuals who share needles/ equipment to inject drugs or recently went to a drug treatment program.

Consult with your physician to determine if this treatment is right for you.

How Can I Pay for PrEP?

The PrEP Assistance Program (PrEP-AP) may be able to help. **For Medicare clients, the PrEP-AP will pay for:**

- 1) Approved PrEP-related medical services, such as doctor visits or labs; and
- 2) Medications on the PrEP-AP formulary used to treat sexually transmitted infections and prevent HIV

Note: For Medicare clients with drug coverage, PrEP-AP pays the co-pay cost for Truvada®; Medicare clients without drug coverage receive Truvada® free of charge from the Gilead Patient Assistance Program

PrEP-AP Eligibility Requirements

Medicare clients without drug coverage must enroll in the Gilead Patient Assistance Program, which provides Truvada® free of charge, before enrolling into PrEP-AP.

Medicare clients with drug coverage are not eligible for the Gilead Patient Assistance Program, but are eligible for PrEP-AP.

All PrEP-AP clients must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Are residents of California;
- Have a negative HIV test result (dated within 6 months of the PrEP-AP application);
- Are at least 18 years of age;
- Have an annual Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI) that does not exceed 500 percent of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) based on family size and household income (approximately \$62,450 for a household of one or \$84,550 for a household of two);
- Are not fully covered by Medi-Cal or other third party payers; and
- Are enrolled in the drug manufacturer's assistance program (if eligible).
