- For the Application Narrative references to "Black/AA and/or Latinx" individuals, please replace "Black/AA and/or Latinx" with your specific priority population(s) described in your response to Question 1a of the Application Narrative Template.
- In Section 7, PEP and PrEP, Question 7h contains a typo. It reads: "Describe the EE's existing capacity to link Black/AA or Latinx PLWH to PrEP in the last calendar year". This question should read "Describe the EE's existing capacity to link Black/AA or Latinx priority population(s) PLWH to PrEP in the last calendar year".
