
# **PrEP** is for Women!

### What is PrEP?

**Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP)** is a medication that reduces the chance of getting HIV from sex by 99%<sup>1</sup>. PrEP reduces the chance of getting HIV from sharing injection drug equipment by 74%<sup>1</sup>.

# More women could benefit from PrEP.

In 2023, only 6% of all PrEP users in California were female, despite the fact that women represented at least 13% of new HIV diagnoses in 2022<sup>2</sup>.



## **How HIV Spreads**

HIV is a virus that attacks the body's immune system. It is spread by contact with certain bodily fluids (blood, semen, pre-seminal fluid, rectal fluids, vaginal fluids, and breast milk) of a person who has HIV.

### **PrEP Facts**

PrEP **prevents** sexual transmision of HIV. PrEP is covered by most insurance plans, including Medi-Cal.

PrEP is safe to take during pregnancy and breastfeeding.

There are no drug conflicts between PrEP and hormone therapy.

## undetectable = untransmittable



Important to Know: A person living with HIV, who is on treatment and maintains an undetectable viral load, has ZERO risk of transmitting HIV to their sexual partners<sup>4</sup>.

# Protect Your Sexual Health

- Prevent HIV by talking to your provider about PrEP.
- Use protection (condoms, dental dams, etc.).
- Request regular STI screenings including HIV, hepatitis C, and syphilis.
- Complete treatments for STIs.
- Discuss testing in relationships.
- Get mammograms and pap smears, as recommended.
