

**Methodology to Indicate Changes to
DPH-16-013 – Posting of Radiologic Technology Act Authorizing Documents**

California Code of Regulations
Title 17. Public Health
Division 1. Department of Health Services
Chapter 5. Sanitation
Subchapter 4. Radiation
Group 3. Standard for Protection Against Radiation
Article 4. Special Requirements for the Use of X-Ray in the Healing Arts

Amend Section 30305 to read as follows:

§ 30305. General Provisions.

(a) – (d) *No change to text.*

(e) The user shall publically display at each installation where an individual performs, or supervises the performance of, radiologic technology, as defined in section 30400, either:

(1) A copy of each of the individual's applicable current and valid certificate and/or permit issued pursuant to subchapter 4.5 (commencing at section 30400) of this chapter pertaining to the Radiologic Technology Act as defined in Health and Safety Code Section 27; or

(2) A list of all such persons containing:

(A) For each individual, the individual's name, the applicable certificate or permit number, and the expiration date as indicated on the Department issued document. This information shall be in a font size no less than 12 points; and

(B) The list shall contain the statement "A copy of the individual's certificate or permit is available for viewing upon request," in a font size no less than 14 points.

(f) If a user elects to post the list specified in subsection (e)(2), the user shall maintain the certificate or permit or a copy thereof for all individuals identified on the list.
